



Learn, Grow, Serve, Outreach

As summer comes to a close, we were sad to see the ending of Compassion Camp. We held our Compassion Camp closing in conjunction with St. Mark's at the pavilion and had a wonderful time celebrating Compassion together. This is a challenge, however, that does not end with summer. We can always be compassionate people! The children will continue to look for ways to serve and grow their mission in our community.

The children continue to meet via ZOOM for Sunday School. As the church moves to opening for services, our Sunday school schedule may shift a bit. However, Sunday school will continue. We are also going to begin to offer a ZOOM/face to face Wednesday night program. Parents who are not ready to join in this event will be able to participate via ZOOM. Those who are ready will be invited to attend Wednesday night lessons with their children. We plan to meet at the pavilion as long as the weather permits. For now, if the weather is bad, our lesson will move to ZOOM. However, this will be reevaluated each month based on the church's need and COVID numbers.

Outreach:

School has begun and Northfield Elementary teachers need our love. We are collecting masks, GermX, and Expo markers for the Northfield Teachers and staff. Donations can be brought to the church office and left in the Children's Director's office or in the collection bin in the Narthex.

The Outreach ministry worked from April-July to pack lunch bags each week for distribution at McFadden Elementary this summer. Through these bags, we helped provide weekend meals through over 350 packed bags! Each bag included a milk, a juice, a couple of snacks, 2 prepackaged breakfasts, and 2 prepackaged lunches. We know that many families were blessed through this ministry.





Youth Ministry

We are praying for all of our students as they return to school whether that is back in the classroom or doing distance learning from the home! Trinity is here for you and we are hoping to start meeting back in person at the church, but remaining outside to help maintain social distancing and safety protocols. We also want to recognize that our recent graduates will be moving on and we are forming a College Age Group for them and any other students in this age group to have a group to worship and study together. We know this is not the first time Trinity has had a College Age group and we recognize that this age group is difficult due to scheduling under normal circumstances, but our hope is that we can take advantage of Covid 19 to have one be present in a unique way. For our students still in Middle & High School, we will be moving our weekly night to Thursdays due to several having scheduling conflicts the other nights of the week. This will be a learning process to see how it works so thank you in advance for patience and understanding! Our two groups will join together on Sunday nights for a fellowship Sack Dinner time before our Outdoor Evening Service each week.
