I sat with a couple recently as we spoke about their upcoming wedding. During our conversation the groom apparently felt it was important to let me know how he was a believer in God even though he was not a church attender. During our conversation he shared how the two of them are quite active in their middle age and they both enjoy biking on trails, hiking and camping together. With that said you can probably imagine how this man described his faith to me.

As the verses above state, God can be found in many of the delightful riches of this wonderful creation. There is no doubt how true this statement is, God truly surrounds us in this beautiful world. There are times when any of us can simply sit and enjoy our surroundings and certainly find we are in the presence of God. ## MISSION MINDERS, OCTOBER 2018.

The last quarter mission project for 2018, is the <u>Michael J. Fox Foundation for Parkinson's</u> <u>Disease.</u> This foundation, started by actor, Michael J. Fox after he was diagnosed with Parkinson's, has been at the forefront of funding research projects to aid in the development of medicines and treatments that will bring a cure to end this disease.

With its goal to finding a cure for Parkinson's Disease, the foundation takes part in countless case studies that help in different ways including: **Translating genetic findings** into real treatments; with **Researching methods to develop vaccines** that will cure Parkinson's; **Developing newer, more effective drugs** to replace the current standard drug of dopamine, including inhaled drugs that produce the needed effect more quickly than oral drugs, and **Working with the FDA and major drug companies** to effectively speed up the approval process for newer treatments

Because research funding plays a major role in where monies donated are allocated, to date, **over \$800 million has been spent on cutting-edge research projects, \$100 million in 2017 alone**. For each dollar donated to the Fox Foundation, 88 cents go to research. Charity Navigator gives the Fox Foundation a four-star rating.

Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. Please give generously!
