#### Auntie Bett's Sponge :

Ingredients: 4 eggs, separated, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup caster sugar, <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup cornflour,1 heaped Tblsp custard power,1 tsp cream of tartar, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, Copha for greasing.

Method : Preheat oven to 200°F/180°F fan forced. Grease two sponge tins.

NB The Judges at the Nathalia Show told Betty to never use butter to grease your tins because of the salt, so she makes sure to always grease her sponge tins thoroughly with melted copha.

Using mix master or electric mixer beat egg white until stiff peaks form. Add sugar in two stages and beat for further 3-4 minutes. Add egg yolks and beat until combined. In a separate bowl sift dry ingredients several times. Gently fold dry ingredients into mixture until combined. Divide mixture into two sponge tins and bake for 20mins. Remove sponges immediately from their tins to prevent sticking. Place on tea towels to cool (wire rack can be used if it is being iced otherwise it will leave marks). After a few minutes turn over.

Recipe & Method

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.

Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with

the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and

then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be

stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin 20 cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately  $3\frac{1}{2}$  - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Recipe & Method

Ingredients - Preferred 100% Australian Grown Produce Method

Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring

to the boil.

Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.

Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 23cm (9 inch) round cake tin and line with

baking paper.

2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix

to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.

3. Bake for approximately 90 - 100 minutes.

4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.

#### Recipe & Method

1. Pre-heat oven to 190C (moderately hot).

2. Line a 12-hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases - Classic white muffin cases size (35mm Height x 90mm Wide x 50mm Base).

3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl, stir in dates and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.

4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.

5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer, if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.

6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.

7. Show Entries: Four (4) muffins per paper plate.

Ingredients

# TRANSPORT EQUIPMENT



#### REGULATIONS

1. It is a condition of entry that exhibitors and competitors undertake to comply with the following regulations.

- 2. All general entries must be made in writing, on forms supplied by the Society, and signed by or on behalf of the exhibitor and delivered to the Secretary on or before the specified closing dates NO LATE ENTRIES. POST ENTRIES EXCEPTED.
- 3. The Society shall have the right to reject any entry without having to give reason for doing so. Each exhibit must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- 4. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the owner, who, on making the entry, will receive a ticket with the section, class and number thereon.
- 5. All machinery in motion shall be either securely fenced or be in such a position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.
- 6. All exhibits must be in the Showground's, and placed ready for judging at the time shown at head of each section.
- 7. The judge may award a second or third prize instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit. Any exhibit not classified which may be brought forward may receive a prize or certificate of merit as an extra if considered worthy.
- 8. All exhibitors shall permit the Stewards to affix their prize cards notifying the awards of the judges, and shall permit same to remain affixed during the continuance of the show.
- STEWARDS: Should a Steward happen to be an exhibitor in any class in which he is a steward, he must stand aside during the judging of such class and take no part whatever in it. Stewards are requested to observe this rule.
   No Judge shall officiate in any section in which he is exhibiting.
- 11. The Society may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements of entries. They may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if patrons, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors may be required to make a statutory declaration regarding their entries if the Society so desires.
- 12. The decisions of the Judges shall be final and without appeal at law or otherwise, and any exhibitor speaking or acting offensively to a Judge or Official may be disqualified and is liable to have all prizes forfeited. Entries are received subject to this Regulation.
- 13. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Society, with or without the assistance of a Judge, can decide the question.
- 14. The Society shall not be responsible for exhibits. All exhibits left in the Society's grounds for a period of one month shall be sold by the Society to defray expenses.
- 15. No appeal against the decision of the judges will be entertained unless same be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary within 30 minutes of the event, and a deposit of \$25 be made, which will be forfeited if the Society considers the appeal too frivolous. In the event of a protest being received, the same will be considered by a disputes committee and its decision shall be final.
- 16. In case of dispute as to the construction of these Regulations or the meaning of anything in the prize list, the same shall be determined by the Society, whose decisions in all cases shall be final.
- 17. Ages of horses to date from August 1st: sheep from April 1st: cattle as stated in cattle section.
- 18. Prize cards or Ribbons won at other shows must not be exhibited on any exhibit in the exhibition, or placed on pens where stock are housed.
- 19. The exhibitor accepts all responsibility for any damage or injury to any person or property, which may be occasioned by or arise out of the use of any machinery, implement or apparatus of any nature whatsoever used in connection with the Stand and Hereby indemnifies the Nathalia Agricultural Society accordingly.
- 20. Water is available on the Society's ground, but exhibitors of stock will be required to find their own forage.
- 21. In awarding the Championship, unless otherwise stated, the first prize winner of the relative sex in each class of the relative subsection shall be eligible to compete.
- 22. In awarding the Reserve Championship, unless otherwise stated, the first prize winner of the relative sex in each class of the relative subsection, other than the exhibit to which the championship has been awarded, shall be eligible to compete, together with the second prize winner, in the class on which the Champion was awarded first prizes not honored by the sponsor of any event.
- 23. The privilege of distributing Trade list advertising or other documents is restricted exclusively to exhibitors at their respective stands.
- 24. Prize winners are requested to hand money vouchers in at the Secretary's Office for payment, after collecting their exhibits from the Ladies Pavilion.
- 25. Prize money may be collected on the Sunday after Show Day from 10am to 11am.
- 26. Any infringement of these rules will disqualify exhibitors from taking any prize awarded to them, and from exhibiting in the future.
- 27. The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or miss delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition or any loss or damage thereto.
- 28. Livestock to be tethered securely at all times except during Judging and the Grand Parade when they must be securely tied and held while being led. Any damage or injury to any person or property by loose animals to be the owners responsibility.
- 29. Owners to have their own Insurance cover for loss or damage of animals and any damage they may cause.
- 30. The Society will not be responsible for any prizes not honored by the sponsor of any event.

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




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
