Everyone enjoyed and appreciated the Center's Christmas. Thank you all for your support, prayers and donations for making Christmas special for many people.

List of items we use all the time:

Kitchen: bottled water, fruit cups, snacks, chips, sliced cheese, sandwich bags, lunch bags, To go containers, trash bags (35-55 gal) toilet tissue, bleach

Pantry: canned vegetables, canned fruit, soups, tuna, chicken, ravioli, canned & dry beans, rice, pasta, side dishes, crackers, cereal, oatmeal, peanut butter, jelly, catsup, mustard

Hygiene Bags: shampoo, lotion, razors, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, female hygiene items

Homeless: coats, hats, gloves, boots, blankets

Thrift Store: clothes, household items (kitchen, linens, decors, nic nacs), hardware, shop items, garden items, furniture we take almost anything

We provided parents and grandparents a chance to provide their children presents, many of which would not have received without your donations of new and gently used toys.


