PASTOR TOM'S "LITTLE CORNER OF HOGE"

JUNE 2022 - ACTS 2: 7-8, 11

Utterly amazed, those in the crowd asked, "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? We hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!"

As most of you know, I grew up in a small town in Indiana, where everyone knew everyone, and most of us were Christian. Our Christian-faith was the primary undercurrent – A shared set of values that all of us rarely spoke about, but which was a part of our daily fabric of life. When we did open up regarding our faith, I discovered that many of my friends were more vocal about their Christian beliefs than I, and in fact, I often wondered whether my faith was lacking because I wasn't more outspoken regarding my belief in Christ. As I have grown and developed my faith over the years, through personal practice, church membership, and academic study, I have come to realize that there is no single, right way to share the good news of Christ. The story of Pentecost, which we will celebrate on Sunday, June 5th, shows us how God relates to us, and how we can relate to others. It reminds us that the Holy Spirit speaks to each of us in a way that we all can understand – In a way that's familiar to us all. God can work through each of us in a manner well-suited to our own unique talents, personalities, and capabilities – providing many opportunities for us to share our faith with others. Pentecost not only acknowledges, but celebrates the many ways we can authentically share our faith, and when we tell others about how we have seen God at work in the world, it becomes the most powerful witness of all! God still seeks our presence – In the hustle and bustle of each busy day, we may find time to sit quietly in God's presence, and in these precious moments of solitude, we may find intimacy beyond words; for when we draw near to God, God will draw near to us. All God is asking, is for our presence with God – So please remember, that we would love to have your presence with us for Sunday morning worship, because our presence together, draws God near to us, and that's how we experience fellow-

ship together. All of your brothers and sisters at Hoge are seeking your presence, so let the Holy Spirit pf Pentecost fill you with the presence of God, and share your presence with us either on Saturday evening at 5:00 PM, or Sunday morning at 10:30 AM. May God continue to bless and keep you, and please know you are loved and treasured by all of us at Hoge! See you soon in the pews!

Concrete repairs are being evaluated

Toilets behind the stage are being replaced

Inside and outside plumbing issues have been addressed

Stove and oven repairs are complete

Repairs are needed on the flat roofs and are being assessed

Completion of the tuck pointing, caulking and sealing project is on hold due to weather conditions

Many other projects are being evaluated so we can put them into process

Pumpkin Upside-Down Cake-Ingredients: 3 large Eggs, 1 ¼ cup Sugar, 2 teaspoons Cinnamon, ½ teaspoon Ginger, 1 teaspoon Nutmeg, 32oz Pumpkin, 13oz Evaporated Milk, 18oz Yellow Cake Mix, ¾ cup Butter, melted, 1 cup Pecans or Walnuts, chopped, Whipped Topping. Directions: Heat oven to 350 degrees. In bowl, lightly beat eggs. Add sugar, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, pumpkin and milk. Stir until well combined. Pour into ungreased 9 X 13 baking dish or 3 quart casserole dish. Sprinkle dry cake mix evenly over top. Drizzle butter over cake mix. Bake 30 minutes. Remove from oven, sprinkle nuts on top. Tips and tricks: Don't wash **brushes and rollers** after every coat. Just wrap them tightly in clingfilm and they'll stay moist. Add a little bit of **vanilla extract to your paint tin** to prevent overbearing paint fumes. **Old paint spills** will soften up if you rub linseed oil on them. Then you can simply scrape them off! **Double-sided tape** makes a great rug gripper. **Dip scissors** in boiling water before trying to cut any delicate fabrics. Don't stir until you next need to use it. A spring-powered rat trap makes a great automatic door closer when mounted to the back. Old kitchen funnels can be repurposed as brilliant twine dispensers. So handy for avid gardeners!		

Masking tape is perfect for creating stencils with. It'll work anywhere and not leave a mark. A regular broom will be a perfect for a decking stain applicator. Using chalk pens, you can create non-permanent murals on mirrors. Perfect for kids! To prevent paint drips, glue a paper plate to the bottom of your paint cans. Strong coffee or shoe polish for covering up a raw scratch on a piece of dark wood furniture. If you want to make sure your screws never come undone when hanging something new, add drop of clear nail varnish to hole just before tightening. To make nails enter wood smoothly, rub the h a little soap before hammering. On unpolished wood with a dent, add some water, lay brown paper on top and iron. The dent will spring out.
