Bible Story Time

A SHEPHERD BOY IS ANOINTED KING

1 Samuel 16:1-13

After Saul did evil and failed to follow YAHWEH a new king was to be anointed to rule Israel.

YAHWEH said to Samuel, "Until when will you mourn for Saul, for I have rejected him from reigning over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and go. I will send you to Jesse the **Bethlehemite**, for I have seen a king for Me among his sons."

Samuel said, "How can I go? When Saul hears, then he will kill me."

YAHWEH said, "You will take a heifer from the herd in your hand, and say, I have come to sacrifice to YAHWEH. Invite Jesse to the sacrifice and I will make you know what you will do. You will anoint for Me whomever I say to you."

Samuel did what YAHWEH said, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city trembled to meet him, and said, "Do you come in peace?"

He said, "Peace! I have come to sacrifice to YAHWEH. Sanctify yourselves and you shall come with me to the sacrifice." He sanctified Jesse and his sons, and called them to the sacrifice.

It happened as they came in, he saw Eliab, and said, "Surely before YAHWEH is His Messiah."

YAHWEH said to Samuel, "**Do not look on his appearance, nor to the height of his stature, for I have rejected him. For man does not see what He sees. For man looks for the eyes, but YAHWEH looks for the heart.**"

Jesse called to Abinadab, and he passed him before Samuel, but he said, "Also YAHWEH has not chosen this one." Jesse passed Shammah by, but he said, "Also YAHWEH has not chosen this one."

Jesse passed seven of his sons before Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, "YAHWEH has not chosen among these."

Samuel said to Jesse, "Are these all the young men?" And he said, "There yet remains the youngest; and he is feeding the flock."

Samuel said to Jesse, "Send someone to get him and bring him here, for we will not sit until he comes here."

David was brought in. He was ruddy, with beautiful eyes and good form. YAHWEH said, "Rise up, anoint him, for this is he." So, Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers and the Spirit of YAHWEH came upon David from that day and onward.

Israel Fun Facts...

What is a Shepherd?

Written by one of our young readers!

Sheep are mentioned in the Bible more than 500 times, more than any other animal. What is the reason for sheep in the Bible? Sheep were important to the people for food, clothing and other things. Sheep are used throughout the Bible to refer to YAHWEH's people.

Sheep were kept for their milk, meat and especially their wool. The duty of shepherds was to keep their flock together, protect it from predators (like wolves) and guide. In ancient times, shepherds also milked their sheep, and made cheese from this milk. It was mainly a job of men without children; Shepherds were often the younger sons of farmers, who did not inherit any land. In other places, each family would have a family member to shepherd its flock, often a child, or an older person who couldn't help much with harder work. Shepherds would normally work in groups either looking after one large flock, or each bringing their own. They would live in small cabins, often shared with their sheep, and would buy food from local communities.

Why does YAHWEH say Shepherds are important?

John 21:15-17: Then when they dined, Yahshua said to Simon Peter, Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me more than these? He said to Him, Yes, Master, You know that I love You. He said to him, **Feed My lambs!** Again He says to him, secondly, Simon, son of Jonah, do you love Me? He says to Him, Yes, Master, You know that I love You. He said to him, **Shepherd My sheep!** Thirdly, He said to him, Simon son of Jonah, do you love Me? Peter was grieved that He said to him a third time, Do you love Me? And he said to Him, Master, You perceive all things, You know that I love You! Yahshua said to him, **Feed My ewes!**

Do you know why Yahshua told Simon Peter to take care of His flock so many times?

Let's put it like this, YAHWEH and Yahshua are like our Shepherds, and we are the sheep. Yahshua wanted Simon Peter to take care of His congregation, to protect it from the wolves and other predators after He left the earth. And as long as we stay close to our Shepherd (Yahweh and Yahshua) than He can fight off the wolves.

Remember, never stray too far from the Shepherd!





HEBREW LESSON


The Kaf/Khaf is the **Eleventh** letter of the Hebrew Alphabet. There are two possible ways this letter can be pronounced.



If there is no dot, the letter is pronounced "KH" as in bach.

Every letter of the Hebrew Alphabet represents a picture!


Five Hebrew letters are formed differently when they appear as the last letter of a word.



If there is a dot in the middle of the letter called a dagesh mark, then the letter is pronounced like a "K" as in kite.

These are called "Sofits" (pronounced so-feet) and they take the same sound as the original.

Practice writing your Hebrew using the lines below.



Hebrew is read and written from right to left.

Ka'khol - כָּחֹל (Blue)

In this word the Kaf would take the "ka" sound because of the Kamats vowel point below and the dot in the middle.

Ana'Khee - אָנָּחִי (Vertical)

In this word the Khaf would take the "khee" sound because of the vowel point underneath.

Pookh - פּוּךְ (Quilt)

In this word the "Khaf Sofit" would take the hard "ch" sound because it's at the end of the word.

This vowel point is called a "Khataf Patakh." It takes an 'A' and it gives the 'AH' sound as in father.

Healthy Snack Recipe Idea:

HONEY CINNAMON GRANOLA BARS

You can use gluten-free oats & flour to make gluten free!

Ingredients

- 3 1/4 cups old-fashioned rolled oats
- 3/4 cups crispy rice cereal
- 2/3 cups oat flour OR whole wheat pastry flour
- 3 tablespoons coconut sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 2/3 cup honey
- 1/3 cup melted coconut oil
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract



Quick & Easy to Make!

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°F. Line a 9- by 13-inch baking pan with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, stir together oats, crispy rice cereal, flour, brown sugar, baking soda, and salt. Measure honey, melted coconut oil, and vanilla into a measuring cup, then drizzle over oat mixture and stir until all ingredients are completely combined.

Transfer oat mixture into prepared pan and press down very firmly into an even layer. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until light golden brown on top. Remove from oven and use the flat bottom of a small pan or dish to press down granola bars again. Cool in pan for 15 minutes, and then use parchment paper sling to carefully lift granola bars out onto a cutting board (you can leave them sitting on top of the parchment paper). Cool for 5 more minutes and then cut into 12 bars. Remove to a cooling rack to finish cooling completely. Store in an airtight container.



Your righteousness is forever, and Your Torah is truth. Psalms 119:142




How does a law written in the Torah apply today?

Exodus 23:4 - When you happen on the ox of your enemy, or his wandering donkey, returning you shall return it to him.

This Torah law remains forever. It could pertain to a lost or wandering pet or simply an object. For example, if you found something that you knew belonged to your neighbor it would be your responsibility to return it to them. Even if that neighbor is someone that is unfriendly and/or does not like you. Yahshua told us also in Matthew 5:44 to love our enemies; bless those cursing us and to do well to those hating us. By returning what your enemy lost, you are obeying this law in the Torah and showing love to your enemy!

EXPLORE THE ANCIENT CITIES... BETHLEHEM – The House of Bread

Located about five miles south of Jerusalem is one of the oldest cities in Israel. It is called **Bethlehem**, or in Hebrew **Beit Lehem**, which is known as the **House of Bread**. In early times, Bethlehem was called by another name, **EPHRATH** or **EPHRATAH**.

There were several well-known people in the bible who were born and lived in the town of Bethlehem. When Jacob and his family were coming from Bethel on the way Ephrath, they stopped and Rachel gave birth to their son, Benjamin. After a difficult birth, Rachel died and they buried her in Bethlehem (Genesis 35:16,19). Much later on, Ruth and Boaz came to Bethlehem and started their family, which became the *House of David*. Not only was the famous King David born in Bethlehem, but Yahshua the Messiah was born there also (Matthew 2:1)!

Today, the city of Bethlehem is part of the West Bank in Israel. It is occupied and controlled by the Palestinian people with a population of approximately 25,000-30,000 people living there.



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THE BATTLE and the PLUNDER

1st Samuel chapter 30



When David and his men came to Ziklag, they saw that the Amalekites had raided to the Negev, even to Ziklag burning it with fire. They captured the women in it, from the small even to the great; they did not kill anyone, but they led them away.

David and the people grieved because their wives, sons and daughters had been taken captive. They mourned and wept, until they could weep no more. David's two wives Ahinoam and Abigail were taken. He was greatly distressed, because the people said they were going to stone him. They were angry with him, because their sons and daughters were taken.

He made himself strong in YAHWEH and told Abiathar the priest to bring the ephod near to him. David asked of YAHWEH, saying, "Shall I pursue this troop? Shall I overtake it?" YAHWEH said to him, "Pursue, for you shall certainly overtake, and shall certainly recover."

So David went on, and took six hundred men with him. They came to the torrent Besor. Two hundred men stayed there to rest, because they were too exhausted to continue. The other four hundred men pursued with David.



On their way, they found an Egyptian man in the field, and took him to David. They gave him food to eat and water to drink. He ate, and his spirit returned to him, for he had not eaten food nor drunk water three days and three nights.

David asked him, "Whose are you? And from where do you come?" And he said, "I am an Egyptian youth, a slave to an Amalekite man. My master abandoned me, for I had been sick three days." He told David where they raided and what they had done.

David said to him, "Are you able to bring me down to this troop?" And he said, "Swear to me by Elohim that you will neither put me to death, nor deliver me up into my master's hand, and I will bring you down to this troop."

The Egyptian youth brought David and his men to where the troop was located. Behold, they found them spread out over the face of all the earth, eating and drinking and feasting, with all the great plunder which they had taken out of the land of the Philistines, and out of the land of Judah.

David struck them from the twilight evening to the evening of the next day. Not a man of them escaped, except four hundred young men who rode on camels and fled. He recovered all that the Amalekites had taken; and he recovered his two wives. Nothing was missing to them and he brought back all of it.

David came upon the two hundred men at the torrent Besor who were too exhausted to go with him. Every evil and worthless man of the men who had gone with David said, "Because they did not go with me, we will not give any plunder to them which we have delivered."

David said, "You shall not do so, my brothers, with that which YAHWEH has given to us. He has protected us, and has given the troop which came against us into our hand. Who will listen to you in this thing? For as the portion of him who goes down to battle, so shall be his share who remains by the baggage. They shall share together."

And it was so, from that day and forward he commanded it for a statute and for an ordinance for Israel to this day.

DEAD SEA SCROLLS

One of the greatest archaeological treasures discovered in the land of Israel are the Dead Sea Scrolls. The remains of about 800-900 ancient writings were found in some 15,000 fragments. Within the fragments almost all the books of the Hebrew Bible are found. There are also extensive writings about a strict Torah observant Jewish sect of people who also believed in the Messiah. They were called Essenes. It is believed the scrolls were likely written by them and whom also who hid them in the caves to preserve them.

How the scrolls were first discovered...


In 1947, a Bedouin shepherd boy was searching along the cliffs of the Dead Sea when he accidentally came upon a cave which stored seven clay jars containing ancient scrolls. It is said the young shepherd was looking for his lost goat and tossed a stone in one of the caves only to hear the sound of pottery shattering. The cave was one of eleven caves discovered where the scrolls were hidden, which was later named the Qumran site.

The Dead Sea Scrolls are crucial to biblical history and they can be found on display in Jerusalem's Israel Museum at the Shrine of the Book.



Healthy Snack Recipe Idea:

CHEEZY BROCCOLI STICKS

A delicious way to eat your broccoli!!

Ingredients:

- 16oz Frozen Broccoli
- 1 cup Italian Bread Crumbs
- 1-1/2 cups sharp cheddar cheese, shredded
- 3 eggs



Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 375. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
2. Using a steamer, steam frozen broccoli until tender. Let cool.
3. Place the cooked broccoli in a food processor with a standard "s" blade. Process until smooth, about 30 seconds. If you do not have a food processor, you can use a potato masher or hand chopper.
4. In a large bowl, add bread crumbs, cheese, eggs and broccoli. Mix well.
5. Pour mixture onto parchment lined pan. Shape into a large rectangle (about 8" x 12") With a rubber spatula, cut into 8 sticks (1-1/2" x 8") and then cut those 8 in half to create 16 sticks (1-1/2" x 4")
6. Bake for 15 minutes and turn over. Bake for another 15 OR if you want them crispier, bake an additional 5 minutes at a time until the desired crispness.
7. Serve immediately or cool and refrigerate or freeze for later.

Special diet substitutions:

For gluten free: use gluten-free bread crumbs and add Italian seasoning to taste.

For dairy-free: use Daiya cheddar cheese

EXPLORE THE ANCIENT CITIES... A Place to Hide - ZIKLAG

David was in danger and being threatened by the very king he served! This king was Saul. He was jealous of David and sought after his life with a great vengeance. David had to flee and escape the constant pursuit of King Saul. He counted it better to live among the land of Philistines than to perish by the hand of Saul.



In 1st Samuel chapter 27, David came to live in the city of Gath. He became a servant to Achish, the King of Gath, raiding and protecting its borders from the enemies. After some time, David asked the king for the city of Ziklag and Achish gave it to David in return for his service. He lived there with his two wives and an army of six hundred men. They remained in Ziklag for a year and four months and later moved on to Hebron after King Saul died. (1 Samuel 27)

Ziklag was one of the twenty nine villages in the Negev located in the southern border of Judah. The exact location is unknown because the city no longer exists. During the time of Joshua it was assigned to the tribe of Simeon. (Joshua 15:31, 19:5) Much later, when the people of Judah returned to Jerusalem from their captivity, some lived in the village of Ziklag. (Neh 11:28)

YAHWEH delivered His servant David from the face of his enemy and brought him to a place of refuge. David was thankful and spoke to YAHWEH the words of this song:

I love You, O YAHWEH, my strength. YAHWEH is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; He is my El, my Rock; I seek refuge in Him; He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my high tower. Psalm 18:1-2

TREASURE BOX

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:21

Supplies Needed:

- Small box with lid – (like a shoe box)
- Rope: Jute (pictured), yarn, string or thin rope
- Paint colors of your choice
- **Decorations** of your choice - like craft gemstones & pearls (pictured), small stones, shells, small sticks, lace, ribbon, colored paper scraps, dry beans or dry noodles, feathers, buttons, craft pom poms, beads
- Glue
- Scissors
- Bible verse below

You can always find little things outside too!! Maybe take a walk with your family outdoors and collect things to decorate your box!



This will be your treasure box to keep your treasures in. Things like your bible verses, prayers, photos or whatever is special to you! Have fun, take your time and design the box any way you like!!

Instructions:

1. Gather all your supplies and think about how you would like to decorate your box. Place items in places, but don't glue them on yet. Try different designs until you are ready to glue!
2. Starting with lid, if using rope or jute, add glue to box and press rope in the design you choose. Let dry for about half an hour. It will get messy, but use lots of glue to hold everything in place! For circles, see below.
3. Paint the outside of the box and let dry about 2 hours or overnight.
4. Glue your decorations to the outside of the box and paint again if you need to.
5. Cut out the bible verse below and glue to the inside of your box lid.

To make the circle patterns with your rope or jute:

FIRST add large amount of glue to the box before adding rope/jute! Hold the end tip tight between fingers of one hand and with the other hand shape the rope around the rope tip into a circular pattern. You can make the circle as big as you like or small as you like. It gets a little tricky and you may have to try it a couple of times, but don't give up. When you have formed a circle, carefully hold together and press into glue on the box. You can add a smaller circle on top of the bigger circle to make a layered look.

Also pictured, on silver box rope (or jute) is braided.

YAHSHUA LOVES THE LITTLE CHILDREN
Matthew 19:1-2, 13-15

When Yahshua was in Capernaum...

The disciples came to Yahshua, saying, "Who then is greater in the kingdom of Heaven?"

And having called forward a little child, Yahshua set him in their midst.

He said, "Truly I say to you, unless you are converted and become as the little children, not at all can you enter into the kingdom of Heaven. Then whoever will humble himself as this little child, this one is the greater in the kingdom of Heaven. And whoever will receive one such little child in My name receives Me."

Yahshua moved from Galilee and came into the borders of Judea beyond the Jordan and great crowds followed Him, and He healed them there.

Then little children were brought to Him, that He might lay hands on them and might pray. But the disciples rebuked them.

Yahshua said, "Allow the little children and do not hinder them to come to Me, for of such is the kingdom of Heaven."

Laying hands on them, He went away from there.

Israel Fun Facts...

A PLACE WHERE YAHSHUA WALKED

The **Sea of Galilee** is a large fresh-water lake located in northern Israel, fed by the Jordan River. It is also called the Sea of Tiberias, Lake Kinneret and Lake of Gennesaret.



In ancient times, there were as many as nine cities located around the shores of the Sea, with Capernaum and Tiberias being the most famous. Yahshua and His disciples spent time in the Galilee area and He did many miracles there, including the miracle of walking on the water (Matthew 14:22-23).



Hundreds of tons of fish are caught from the lake each year, but the three types of fish favored by fisherman in these waters are sardines, barbels and tilapia or "musht."

Sardines are small fish and were likely the type of fish the boy brought to feed the 5000 (Matthew 14:13-21). The musht fish is known today as "**St. Peter's Fish.**" It was named after the scripture found in Matthew 17:27, in which Peter hooked a fish with a coin in its mouth.

The Sea normally has a peaceful calm, but the waters can quickly change with high waves brought on by a violent storm. The winds funneling through the Galilee hill country can stir up the waters very quickly. If fisherman are caught on the lake during one of these storms it can be deadly. In March 1992, a storm on the Sea sent 10 feet high waves crashing down on the city of Tiberias causing significant damage.

Most exciting, is the discovery of an ancient fishing boat from the 1st century AD that was found in 1986 on the north-west shore of the Sea of Galilee. When the waters receded during a drought, the remains of the boat were found by a local resident in the area. The ancient **Galilee Boat** is currently on display in the Yigal Alon Center on Kibbutz Ginosar.





HEBREW LESSON


The **Mem** is the **Thirteenth** letter of the Hebrew Alphabet. It takes the "M" sound as in mother and milk.

Five Hebrew letters are formed differently when they appear as the last letter of a word. These are called "**Sofits**" (pronounced so-feet) and the Mem is the second of the five. They take the same sound as the original.

Every letter of the Hebrew Alphabet represents a picture!

In this word the first Mem would take the "My" sound because of the patakh vowel below. The second Mem would appear in the Sofit form because it's at the end of the word and take the normal "M" sound as in team.

This vowel point is called a "Khataf Segol." It takes an "E" and it gives the "EH" sound as in bet.



CRAFT CORNER:

BIRD FEEDER

How beautiful are the birds our Heavenly Father created!
Turn a simple plastic water bottle into your very own beautiful bird feeder and watch the little birds come to feed!



Supplies Needed:

- Plastic water bottle
- Thin rope, twine, jute or yarn (jute pictured)
- Dried beans, lentils or peas (split peas and chick peas pictured)
- Ribbon
- Stick from outside about 12-14" long – Bird perch
- Glue
- Scissors
- Marker or a crayon
- Bird Seed



Observe the birds of the heaven, that they do not sow, nor do they reap, nor do they gather into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Do you not rather excel them? Matthew 25:26

Instructions:

1. With a marker or crayon, draw a square window on the front of the bottle and one on the back to match. It should be a couple of inches from the bottom of the bottle.
2. Carefully, cut out the square on the front and back with a pair of scissors. You may need an adult to do this part because it is very tricky and should be done with great care!!
3. Puncture a hole just below the window on front and back. This is where you will thread the stick through.
4. Spread lots of glue on the cap and with your twine circle around the cap pressing it firmly into the glue.
5. Less than half way down the bottle, spread lots of glue below the cap all around the bottle. With your twine, circle the bottle again until you reach the cap. (as pictured)
6. Spread glue on side of bottle and cover with your dried beans or dried peas. Repeat on other side. (as pictured)
7. Glue a couple rows of twine around the bottle, just above the stick.
8. Add your additional beans and ribbon decorations.
9. Let your project dry for at least 30 minutes.
10. When dry, thread the stick through the holes you made in the front and back of the bottle.
11. For the hanging twine, cut a long piece of twine. Loop one end once around bottle cap and tie into a tight knot. With the other end, go around the bottle top once and then tie it tightly into a knot. Knots should line up opposite each other to balance the hanging bird feeder.
12. Add your birdseed and hang on a tree in your yard or hang it somewhere on your porch!

Variations:

You can use brightly colored yarn instead of jute and decorate with buttons, ribbon and beads instead of beans/peas.



Bible Story Time

A COVENANT FRIENDSHIP – DAVID and JONATHAN

1 Samuel 18:1-4, 19:1-7, 20:12-42

When David finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knitted with the soul of David; and Jonathan loved him as his own soul. Saul took him that day, and would not let him return to his father's house. **Jonathan and David cut a covenant**, because he loved him as his own soul. Jonathan stripped off his robe and gave it to David; also his apparel, his sword, his bow and his belt.



Do you remember the 9 steps of the Hebrew covenant?

After a short while, Saul spoke to his son Jonathan, and to all his servants, to kill David. Jonathan told David, "My father Saul is seeking to kill you. Please be on guard in the morning, and stay in the secret place, and hide. I will go out and stand by my father's side in the field where you are. I will speak of you to my father, and shall see what it is, and will tell you."

Jonathan spoke good of David to his father Saul, and said to him, "Do not let the king sin against his servant David, because he has not sinned against you; also because his works for you are very good. He has put his life in his hand and killed the Philistine. And YAHWEH worked a great deliverance for all Israel. You saw it and rejoiced. Why do you sin against innocent blood, to put David to death for no reason?"



Saul listened to Jonathan's voice, and swore, "**As YAHWEH lives he shall not die.**" Jonathan called David, and Jonathan told him all these words.

Jonathan brought David to Saul, and he was before him as yesterday and the day before.

Again, Saul sought David's life and he fled to Ramah. Jonathan said to David, "YAHWEH the Elohim of Israel be witness when I search my father about this time tomorrow, or the third day, if there is good toward David and I do not send to you and do not tell you, so may YAHWEH do to Jonathan and do much more than this. If my father should think to do evil to you, then I will tell you and send you away. You will go in peace; and may YAHWEH be with you, as He was with my father. Not only when I live, **but you shall not cut off the kindness from my house forever.**"

Jonathan covenanted with the house of David, that YAHWEH should seek it from the hand of David's enemies. Jonathan again made David swear, because he loved him; for he loved him as he loved his own soul.

Jonathan said to him, "Tomorrow is the new moon, and you will be expected, for your seat will be empty. On the third day, quickly come down, and come to the place where you were hidden. Remain near the stone Ezel and I will shoot three arrows to the side, shooting at a mark for myself. I will send a boy and tell him to find the arrows! If I say to the boy, *the arrows are on this side of you, take them*; **then you come**, for **there will be peace for you and there is nothing to happen**, as YAHWEH lives. But, if I say to the young man, *the arrows are away from you and onwards*; **you go away David, for YAHWEH has sent you away**. As to the thing which we have spoken, you and I; YAHWEH is between you and me forever."

David was hidden in the field and it was the new moon.

The king sat down to eat on the seat by the wall. Jonathan rose up, and Abner sat at Saul's side. David's place was empty. Saul did not say anything on that day, for he said, "It is an accident; he is not clean; he is surely not clean."

It happened on the day after the new moon, David's place was empty. Saul said to his son Jonathan, "Why has the son of Jesse not come to the meal, either yesterday or today?"



Jonathan answered Saul, "David earnestly asked of me to go to Bethlehem. He said, please send me away, for we have a family sacrifice in the city, and my brother commanded me. And now, if I have found favor in your eyes, please let me be released, to see my brothers. So he has not come to the table of the king."

The anger of Saul glowed against Jonathan. And he said to him, "Son of a perverse rebelliousness! Do I not know that you have chosen the son of Jesse to your shame, and to the shame of the nakedness of your mother? For as long as the son of Jesse lives on earth you will not be established, you and your kingdom. Now bring him to me, for he is a son of death. Jonathan answered his father Saul, and said to him, "Why should he die? What has he done?"

Saul threw the spear at him, to strike him. Jonathan knew that it had been determined by his father to kill David. Jonathan rose up from the table in the heat of anger. He did not eat food on the second day of the new moon, for he was grieved for David. For his father had put him to shame.



It happened in the morning that Jonathan went out in the field to meet with David. A little boy was with him. He said to the boy, "Now run and find the arrow which I am shooting." The boy ran, and he shot the arrow, causing it to pass over him. The boy came to the place of the arrow which Jonathan had shot. Jonathan called after the boy and said, "**Is the arrow not away from you and onwards?**"

Jonathan called after the boy, "Hurry, make haste, do not stand!" Jonathan's boy gathered the arrow and came to his master. The boy did not know anything. Only Jonathan and David knew the matter.

Jonathan gave his weapons to the boy with him, and said, "Go, bring them to the city." The boy left, and David rose up from the south side. He fell on his face to the ground and bowed three times. They each one kissed his friend and wept, until David was overcome.

Bible Story Time

The Young Men Who Would Not Compromise

Daniel 1:1-20

In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it. YAHWEH gave Jehoiakim, king of Judah, into his hand, with part of the vessels of the house of Elohim, which he carried into the land of Shinar to the house of his god. And he brought the vessels into the treasure house of his god.



The king spoke to Ashpenaz, the chief of his eunuchs that he should bring some of the sons of Israel, and of the king's seed, and of the nobles, young men in whom was no blemish, but who were of good appearance and having understanding in all wisdom, having knowledge and understanding learning, even those with strength in them to stand in the king's palace, and to teach them the writing and the language of the Chaldeans.

The king set to them the portion of a day in its day, from the king's food, and the wine of his drinking, even to rear them three years, so that at their end they may stand before the king.



There were among them of the sons of Judah, Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, to whom the chief of the eunuchs gave names. For he called Daniel, Belteshazzar; and Hananiah, Shadrach; and Mishael, Meshach; and Azariah, Abednego.

Daniel laid on his heart that he would not defile himself with the king's food, or with the wine of his drinking. So he asked of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself. The Elohim had given Daniel kindness and compassion before the chief of the eunuchs.

The chief of the eunuchs said to Daniel, "I fear my master the king, who has appointed your food and your drink. For why should he see your faces worse looking than the boys who are in your age group? Then you would forfeit my head to the king."



Daniel said to Melzar, whom the chief of the eunuchs had set over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, "Please, test your servants ten days and let vegetables be given to us that we may eat, and water that we may drink. Then let be seen before you, our look and the look of the boys who eat of the king's food. And as you see, do so with your servants."

He listened to them in this matter and tested them for ten days.

At the end of ten days their appearance looked better and fatter of flesh than all the boys who were eating the king's food. So Melzar took away their food and the wine that they were to drink, and he gave them vegetables.



As for these four boys, the Elohim gave them knowledge and skill in all writing and wisdom. Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams.

Now at the end of the days that the king had said to bring them in, the chief of the eunuchs brought them in before Nebuchadnezzar. The king talked with them.

Among them all was found none like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. So they stood before the king. And in any matter of wisdom and understanding that the king asked from them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians and the conjurers who were in all his kingdom.





Explore the Ancient Cities...

ANCIENT BABYLON

During the reign of King Nebuchadnezzar II, the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem. They brought Yahweh's people from the Southern Kingdom of Judah to Babylon where they remained in captivity for 70 years. Ancient Babylon was the capital city in the land of Babylonia located in southern Mesopotamia. It was located on the River Euphrates near the Persian Gulf, which today is modern Baghdad in the country of Iraq.

The name Babylon is Greek for the Hebrew name Babel. In the Bible (Genesis 11:9) the word *Babel* means "confusion".

The earliest known inhabitants of Mesopotamia were called Sumerians. The Sumerian culture became the basis of Babylonia. They worshipped pagan gods and built temples in each city. The Bible refers to these people as the people of the "land of Shinar" (Gen 10:10). Later on, the Amorites migrated to the area. They introduced the pagan god Marduk, starting around 1100 BC in the city of Babylon, which became the primary god of the Babylonian religion.

Assyria was located on the northern border of Babylonia. About 1270 BC, the Assyrians overpowered Babylonia and became more dominant in the ancient world, than their neighbor Babylonia. In 722 BC, the Northern Kingdom of Israel was conquered and the captive Israelites were taken away to Assyria.

Babylonia finally became more powerful than Assyria when Nebuchadnezzar II became the ruler in 605 BC and he reigned for 44 years. Plundering treasures from other nations, Nebuchadnezzar was able to build Babylon, and it became one of the leading cities of the ancient world.

The Babylonian empire fell in 540 BC when King Cyrus moved his armies into Babylon. He redirected the Euphrates River that ran through the city of Babylon and marched his soldiers up the riverbed taking the Babylonians by surprise.



Did you Know?

Daniel and the three sons of Judah were given Babylonian names to replace their Hebrew birth names, but their Hebrew names reminded them of their One True Elohim, YAHWEH. Each name has a special meaning:

Daniel means **Yahweh is my judge**
Hananiah means **Yahweh is gracious**
Mishael means **Who is like Yahweh?**
Azariah means **Yahweh is my helper**

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

John 6:1-15



Yahshua went away over the Sea of Galilee, of Tiberius. A great crowd followed Him, for they saw His miracles which He did on the sick ones.

Yahshua went up into the mountain and sat there with His disciples.

The Passover was near, the feast of the Jews. Then Yahshua lifting up His eyes and seeing that a great crowd is coming to Him, He said to Philip, "From where may we buy bread that these may eat?" But He said this to test him, for He knew what He was about to do.

Philip answered Him, bread for two hundred denarii are not enough for them, that each of them may receive a little. One of His disciples said to Him, Andrew the brother of Simon Peter, "A little boy is here who has five loaves of barley and two fish; but what are these for so many?"

Yahshua said, "Make the men to recline." Much grass was in the place. Then the men reclined, the number was about five thousand.



Yahshua took the loaves, and giving thanks distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to those reclining. In the same way the fish, as much as they desired.

Israel Fun Facts

Fields of BARLEY

Wheat and barley are the two main grains grown and harvested in Israel, especially during the times of the Bible. These grains are also two of Israel's seven species of the land that can grow on their own without the intervention of man. Barley can be grown in areas that are too dry for wheat and it will mature much faster than wheat. It was the main food for the poor to grind into flour and baked into cakes and loaves of bread. Less desired than wheat, it was often considered as animal fodder or feed.




Barley is mentioned throughout the Bible. The book of Ruth has several references of barley. Can you think of a certain "kinsman redeemer" who had fields of barley?

If you said Boaz, you are correct! He came from Bethlehem and he was a successful farmer of the barley crop. It was at the beginning of the barley harvest when Naomi and Ruth came into Bethlehem. The barley harvest started right after Passover and continued until Shavuot. In some areas of Bethlehem today, barley is still an important crop grown in small plots and harvested by hand as described in the book of Ruth.




Ice Cube Boat

Make your own little boat,
or two, out of an ice cube!

Supplies You Will Need:

~ For one boat

- a plastic cup
- flexible, bendable straw
- tape
- construction paper
- scissors
- hole punch



Instructions to Make:

1. Bend your straw at the flexible spot on the straw and tape the short end to the bottom of the plastic cup.
2. Fill the bottom of the cup with about 2-3 inches of water and let it freeze for a few hours.
3. After it has frozen, run water on the outside of the cup to loosen the ice so you can remove it from the cup.
4. Using construction paper, cut a square (about 4"x 4" or larger if you prefer) to make the sail. You could also cut a triangle or rectangle instead of a square.
5. In the center of your sail, punch two holes, one close to top and the other near the bottom.
6. Thread your straw through the holes.
7. Place your ice boat in a cold bowl of water. Now, your boat is ready to sail!



Tip: To make your boat last longer, place it back in the freezer for the next time to sail!
If it has melted too much, put it back in the cup and re-fill with water.

Bible Story Time

The Prison Doors Were Loosened – Paul and Silas

Acts 16:16-39

A certain woman named Lydia, a seller of purple of the city of Thyatira, one reverencing Elohim, listened, whose heart the Master opened thoroughly to pay attention to the things being spoken by Paul. As she and her household were baptized, she entreated Paul, saying, "If you have judged me to be believing in the Master, entering into my house, remain." She strongly urged us.

It was while we went to the house of prayer, a certain damsel met us in whom was a spirit of divination, and she had produced her overlords much gain by her divination. Following after Paul and us, she cried out, saying, "These men are slaves of the Most High Elohim, who are announcing to us a way of salvation!"

She did this over many days. But becoming distressed, and turning to the demonic spirit, Paul said, "In the name of Yahshua Messiah I command you to come out from her!" It came out in that same hour. Seeing that the hope of their gain went out, having seized Paul and Silas, her masters dragged them to the market. Bringing them near to the soldiers and magistrates, they said, "These men are very much troubling our city, being Jews, and preach customs which it is not lawful for us to accept, nor practice, being Romans."

The crowd rose up against them. And tearing off their clothes, the magistrates ordered men to scourge them. Laying on them many stripes, they threw them into prison, charging the jailer to keep them securely, who, receiving such a charge, threw them into the inner prison, and locked their feet in the stocks.



And the jailer announced these words to Paul, "The magistrates have sent that you be let go. Now, then, going out, proceed in peace."

But Paul said to them, "Having beaten us publicly, being Romans and uncondemned men, they threw us into prison. And now do they throw us out secretly? No, indeed! But coming themselves let them bring us out."

The floggers reported these words to the magistrates. Hearing that they were Romans, they were afraid. And coming, they begged them. Bringing them out, they asked them to go out of the city.

Going out from the prison, they went into the house of Lydia. And seeing the brothers, they exhorted them, and went out.

How did Paul and Silas help the jailer and his family?




Having prayed, toward midnight Paul and Silas praised Elohim in a hymn. And the prisoners listened to them. Suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the jail were shaken. Immediately all the doors were opened and all of the bonds were loosened.

Having been awakened, and seeing that the doors of the prison had been opened, having drawn a sword, the jailer was about to do away with himself, supposing the prisoners to have escaped.

But Paul called out with a loud voice, saying, "Do no harm to yourself! For we are all here." Asking for lights, he rushed in. Becoming trembling, he fell before Paul and Silas. Leading them outside, he said, "Sirs, what must I do that I may be saved?" And they said, "Believe on the Master Yahshua Messiah, and you will be saved, you and your household."

Explore the Ancient City...

THYATIRA

While staying several days in Philippi, Paul and Silas were asked to remain with the house of Lydia. Lydia was a merchant woman who sold purple

dye in the ancient city of Thyatira. Thyatira was a wealthy, busy textile and trade city located in Western Turkey attracting the wool workers, coppersmiths, linen weavers, tanners and dyers. It was also one of the cities where money was first used.

Lydia is described in the bible as a "seller of purple." To make this purple dye, it is believed the dyers used a natural coloring substance from the root of a plant called madder. The shades of colors coming from the madder root ranges from bright orange to scarlet red, and pink red with a bluish tint. The color obtained from this dye is now called Turkish red.


Today, Thyatira is named Akhisar which is Turkish for "white castle." The village is fairly large with mainly Greek and Armenian residents living there. Still living among them are some of the Jewish people. Ancient pagan temple ruins exist in the higher part of the town. Rug-making is a main modern industry in Akhisar this day.

There are seven congregations named in the book of Revelation (Revelation 2:18-28) and Thyatira is the fourth congregation.


The Peh/Fey is the **Seventeenth** letter of the Hebrew Alphabet. There are two possible ways this letter can be pronounced.



If there is no dot, the letter takes the "F" or "PH" sound as in Frank or photo.

Every letter of the Hebrew Alphabet represents a picture!


Five Hebrew letters are formed differently when they appear as the last letter of a word. The letter Peh is the fourth of the five.



These are called "Sofits" (pronounced so-feet) and they usually take the same sound as the original. The Peh as a final letter of a word, almost never has a dot in it. So it is usually pronounced with the "F" sound.

If there is a dot in the middle of the letter called a dagesh mark, then the letter is pronounced like a "P" as in peace.

Turn a Negative into a Positive by Reframing

Reframing is the ability to look at a situation or experience from a different perspective or view. It is turning a negative thought process into a positive thought process.

Let's look at a few of the differences between a negative perspective and a positive perspective:

Negative perspective

- Brings self-pity – thinking only about yourself
- Focused on the problem
- No concern for those around you



Positive perspective

- Motivates you to make changes
- Focused on solution to fix the problem
- Gives you courage and boldness to face life

What are some things we can do to learn how to reframe a situation?

- Think about what Yahshua would do in the situation and how He would react to the problem.
- Take focus off yourself and the situation and look at the bigger picture.
- Remember things could always be worse!
- Be willing to learn from your experience – Life is an adventure and a test!
- No matter how bad things get, always remember you are still alive and breathing and that alone is plenty to be grateful for!
- If someone insults or offends you, look at the situation from their perspective and try to understand why they might have done that – put yourself in their shoes!
- Focus on the things you have and not on the things you don't have.
- Most importantly, pray and ASK YAHWEH to help you and HE WILL!

Group Activity: THE REFRAME GAME

- Each person will write down a situation or experience that could be looked at as negative.
- Then taking turns, each person will share out loud the situation they wrote down.
- Everyone else will help the person reframe the situation into something positive!

Hanging Scripture Placard

Supplies Needed:

- 5 large Craft sticks
- Wide tape (clear packing tape works well)
- Glue stick or liquid glue
- Ribbon
- Colored paper (1 sheet)
- Scissors
- Bible scripture of your choice (next page)
- Embellishments: beads, Craft gems, Craft poms, etc.
- Optional: Glitter and/or paint



All of the pictured examples were designed by YAHWEH's precious little lambs!

Instructions:

1. Tear off a large piece tape and press down a Craft stick on left side of tape. Line another Craft stick on top of it and repeat until all 5 sticks are stuck on the tape. Repeat with another strip of tape (about 3 total) until the back is completely secured with tape.
2. Tape each end of a small piece of ribbon (about 9") to the back of your placard.
3. If you prefer, you can cut a square piece of colored construction paper to fit the back and glue it over the tape. This will give a nice backing cover to your placard.
4. Glue bible verses to front of placard.
5. Decorate the front of your Bible scripture placard with your embellishments.
6. Let the glue dry for at least 30 minutes and then it's ready to hang in a place you like.

Hint: If you don't have the Craft items, you can use any item you have in the house or even outdoors and it will work just fine! Be Creative and have fun!

What Can You Give?




HEBREW LESSON


The **Tsadi** is the **eighteenth letter** of the Hebrew Alphabet. It takes the "TS" sound as in pizza.

Five Hebrew letters are formed differently when they appear as the last letter of a word. These are called "**Sofits**" (pronounced so-feet) and the Tsadi is the last of the five. They take the same sound as the original.

Every letter of the Hebrew Alphabet represents a picture!

Colorful Music Maracas

Turn an empty water bottle into a musical instrument you can use when singing praises to YAHWEH!

Supplies Needed:

- 1 small empty water bottle with cap
- Cardboard toilet paper roll, cut off about $\frac{1}{4}$ on the end so your handle won't be too long
- Shaker Material = Small amount of rice, popcorn, colored beads and or beans (about 2-3 TBS)
- Glue
- Colored tape and/or paint
- Decorations of your choice



Instructions:

1. Make sure your water bottle is completely dried out, with no water drops. Once dry, fill water bottle with a small amount of shaker material such as rice, popcorn, etc.
2. Put the cap on the bottle and shake it a couple of times to test the sound. You can add more material to get the sound you like.
3. Once you are finished filling your bottle, return the cap.
4. For the handle: cut the cardboard toilet paper roll down the middle. Wrap the roll around the end of the cap tightly and tape together with colored tape. Be sure to tape the top of the roll tightly to the bottle. This will hold the handle in place.
5. Now you can paint and/or decorate your maraca with your decorations.

The Breaking of Uzzah and the Fear of YAHWEH


2 Samuel 6:1-12

David again gathered every chosen one in Israel, thirty thousand.

David rose up and went, and all the people with him, from Baal-Judah, to bring up the ark of the Elohim from there, which is called by the Name, the Name of YAHWEH of Hosts, who dwells above the cherubs over it. They made to ride the ark of the Elohim on a new cart, and took it from the house of Abinadab, which is in the hill.



Uzzah and Ahio the sons of Abinadab were leading the new cart. They took it from the house of Abinadab, which is in the hill, with the ark of the Elohim. Ahio was going before the ark. David and all the house of Israel were dancing before YAHWEH with all instruments of fir wood, with lyres and with harps, and with tambourines, and with cornets, and with cymbals. When they came to the threshing floor of Nachon, and Uzzah reached out to the ark of the Elohim, and took hold of it, for the oxen nearly upset it.




Then the anger of YAHWEH burned against Uzzah. And the Elohim struck him there for the fault. He died there by the ark of the Elohim. And it angered David because YAHWEH broke out a break against Uzzah. One calls that place The Breaking of Uzzah to this day.

David feared YAHWEH on that day, and said, "How shall the ark of YAHWEH come to me?" David was not willing to bring the ark of YAHWEH to himself, to the city of David.

David turned it aside to the house of Obed-Edom the Gittite. And the ark of YAHWEH remained in the house of Obed-Edom the Gittite three months. YAHWEH blessed Obed-Edom and all his house. It was told to King David, saying, YAHWEH has blessed the house of Obed-Edom and all that is his, because of the ark of the Elohim.

David went and brought up the ark of the Elohim from the house of Obed-Edom to the city of David with joy.

Do your parents give you chores or other things to do that are just for you? Are they to be done in a very specific way? Uzzah was an example of Yahweh showing how a good intention does not excuse a bad action.

Israel Fun Fact...

How was Wheat Processed in Ancient Israel?

Yahshua often talked about wheat and gave many comparisons to help us understand scripture.

Wheat grain was ready to be harvested when the kernels could be pinched and no longer produce a milky substance. The head or spike at the top of the wheat stalk will be bent over due to the weight of the grain kernels. It has the appearance of bowing down.



The wheat is bowing down

Some of the wheat in the field will stand straight up because there are no wheat kernels in them. Their spikes are just empty shells that produced no wheat kernels. These would also be harvested and bundled into sheaves along with the wheat that did produce grain.

After the wheat was picked and bundled into sheaves, it was taken to a threshing floor to separate the wheat kernels from the outer shell (**chaff**) that covers the kernels. This part of the process was called **threshing**. The hard stone floor used for threshing was usually located on the edge of a village on top of a hill, so the blowing wind could help in the separation process.

The sheaves would be loosened upon the floor and placed around in circle. Oxen would be made to move around the circle of the floor to trample over the sheaves separating the kernels of grain from the stalk.

Another method was to drag a wooden sled over the sheaves. A person would sit on the sled to make it heavier and another person pulled the sled over the sheaves. Now, that's teamwork! The sled had many holes filled with rocks to help thresh the grain.



Threshing Sled and Wincrowing Rake


After being threshed, the grain would be thrown into to the air with a wincrowing tool so the wind could blow away all the chaff while the grain would fall back onto the floor. This was called the **wincrowing** process.

After threshing and wincrowing the grain it was passed through a large basket with small holes to sift and remove any remaining chaff or dust particles. Then the grain would be gathered up and put into a storehouse to later be ground into flour.

How does a law written in the Torah apply today?

One witness shall not rise against a man for any iniquity, or for any sin, in any sin which he sins. At the mouth of two witnesses, or at the mouth of three witnesses a thing shall be established.
Deut. 19:5

Why do we need more than one witness to a sin?

Imagine that you and your sister are fighting, she raises her arm because she is yelling and breaks your mother's favorite coffee cup. Your mother comes in and sees both of you sitting and looking at the broken pieces and asked "who broke my cup"? You both look at one another and say, "she did"! Your mother looks up and sees your two younger brothers have been peeking behind the kitchen door and have seen the whole thing.

Yahweh wants there to be two or even three witnesses (people who actually saw what happened) for a couple of reasons.

First, Yahweh uses many witnesses to confirm that a story is true. That way an innocent person will not be wrongly accused of a sin and the guilty person will be correctly accused and receive the punishment they deserve.

Second, Yahweh uses it to help us correct our brother who may be at fault and will not repent even though you have witness his wrong doing. He allows you to take the matter to two or three other witnesses as proof of the need to repent.

How many gospels (witnesses) are there about the life of Yahshua?

CRAFT CORNER:



Make Your Own Musical Tambourine (Timbrel)

Supplies Needed: Makes 2 tambourines!

- 2- 7" Round embroidery hoops (you will need two so you can separate into matching sizes)
- 10 – metal bottle caps, not smashed or dented (you can usually find these outside on the ground)
- 15 – round metal washers
- 5 wide craft sticks (popsicle sticks)
- Roll of thin wire
- Felt or fabric
- Ribbon
- Beads, pearls, and flowers, glitter
- Glue gun and glue
- Pencil or pen
- Scissors
- Hammer and pliers
- Heavy duty sandpaper
- Long nail

Instructions:

To prepare bottle caps:


- Sand the words and paint off of each bottle cap with the sandpaper.
- Remove the plastic lining on the inside of the cap to the best of your ability.
- Wash the bottle caps in hot water and dry them. You can also paint them at this time or just leave them the natural gold and silver as seen in the picture.
- With the pliers, pull out the edges of the cap so they fan out. Then turn the cap upside down on pavement and smash it flat with the hammer. Turn it over and smash it again. Repeat a couple of times until it is flat.
- Once flattened, place the sharp end of the nail in the center of the cap and with the hammer, pound it until it makes a hole.

To prepare the hoops:

- With the pliers, carefully remove the metal hardware that is on the top hoop. Don't worry about the holes, they will be covered with felt and you won't see them.
- Now match the hoops with each other so they are the same size. (The top hoop on embroidery hoops are always larger than the bottom hoop) This is why you need two sets of hoops. You can give the other tambourine as a gift to someone!

Spacers:

- Measure each craft stick to about 1 3/4" and mark with a pencil. Cut them with the scissors.
- Place the spacers equally around the inside of the hoops in five different places and mark the spots with a pencil. Don't worry if they are off a bit, again, the felt will cover any little imperfections. Once you know where they will be placed, glue the top edge to the top hoop and the bottom edge to the lower hoop. *See example below.*




Caps and Wire:

- Cut 5 pieces of wire (about 16" long).
- Between each spacer, wrap one end of the wire around the top hoop a couple of times tightly.
- Now thread a washer, cap, washer, cap, washer on the wire.
- Wrap the other end around the bottom hoop a couple of times and then thread back through the caps and washers. Pull it tight and tie the end of the wire. This will give it extra strength. If you have thicker wire, one time through the caps and washers is fine. *See example below.*



Once you have finished wiring the caps in place around the hoops, you can decorate with your felt, ribbons, flowers, beads etc.!

The Parable of the Eleventh Hour Workers

Matthew 20:1-16

MINI LESSON DISCUSSION:

For the kingdom of Heaven is like a man, a house Master, who went out when it was early to hire workers into his vineyard.

He bargained with the laborers for a denarius per day. He sent them to his vineyard.

And going out about the third hour, he saw others standing idle in the market. He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and I will give you whatever is just." And they went.

Again, going out about the sixth and ninth hour, he did the same. Going out about the eleventh hour, he found others standing idle, and said to them, "Why do you stand here idle all day?"

They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and you will receive whatever is just."

But evening having come, the master of the vineyard said to his manager, "Call the workers and pay them the wage, beginning from the last to the first."

The ones having come the eleventh hour each received a denarius.



Having come, the first supposed that they would receive more. They also each received a denarius. And having received it, they murmured against the house Master, saying, "These last have performed one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden and the heat of the day."

But answering, he said to one of them, "Friend, I did you no wrong. Did you not agree to a denarius with me? Take yours and go.

But I desire to give to this last as also to you. Or is it not lawful for me to do what I desire with my things? Or is your eye evil because I am good?

So the last shall be first, and the first last; for many are called, but few chosen."

When the eleventh hour workers received the same wage as those who worked all day, what did the "all day" workers do against the house Master? And why was that wrong?

As you receive the strips of paper from everyone, interlink and glue the ends to each other to form a long chain.





A Lesson on Good Stewardship





After everyone has finished eating dinner in the evening and still sitting at the table, Dad will pull out the strips of paper from the children's pockets and read them out loud for everyone to hear.

Mom will collect all the children's strips of paper and tape them onto a white sheet of paper. Then the sheets of paper can be put into a page protector and placed in a family binder for everyone to go back and read later.




Supplies Needed:

- Cork Board and tacks
- Colored Card Stock or heavy paper for pocket folders (*the amount will depend on how large or small your family is!*)
- Scissors
- Marker or crayon for writing names
- Stapler or tape
- White or colored paper cut in wide strips
- Notebook binder
- White copy paper
- Plastic Sheet Protectors

Instructions:

To Make the Pockets ~

1. Cut the card stock into even squares about 6" x 4" – one pocket for each person in the family (*including Dad and Mom*) and one for the white strips of paper
2. To form the pocket, fold each square in half, but leave about an inch at the top
3. (*the top part is where the tack will be placed to pin to the bulletin board*)
4. Staple or tape each side of the pocket to seal up the sides
5. Write each person's name in the family on their own individual pocket
6. With the tacks, pin the pockets onto the cork board

YAHWEH's Covenant with Abram and Sarai

Genesis 17:1-9, 15-22

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, YAHWEH appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am El Shaddai! Walk before me and be perfect; and I will make My covenant between Me and you, and will increase you very greatly."

Abram fell on his face. And Elohim spoke with him, saying, "As for Me, behold, My covenant is with you, and you shall be a father of many nations. And your name no longer shall be called Abram, but your name shall be Abraham."

"For I have made you a father of many nations. And I will make you very fruitful, exceedingly. And I will give you for nations. And kings shall come out of you. And I will establish My covenant between Me and you, and your seed after you in their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be a Elohim to you and to your seed after you. And I will give to you and to your seed after you the land of your sojourning, all the land of Canaan, for an ever-lasting possession and I will be their Elohim."

Elohim said to Abraham, "You shall keep My covenant, you and your seed after you in their generations."

Elohim said to Abraham, "You shall not call your wife Sarai by her name Sarai, for Sarah shall be her name; and I have blessed her and have also given to you a son from her. Yea, I have blessed her and she shall become nations; kings of people shall be from her."

Abraham fell on his face and laughed. He said in his heart, "Shall one be born to a son of a hundred years? And shall Sarah bear a daughter of ninety years?"

Abraham said to Elohim, "Oh that Ishmael might live before You!"

Elohim said, "Your wife Sarah truly shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name Isaac. And I have established My covenant with him for a perpetual covenant with his seed after him. And as to Ishmael, I have heard you. Behold, I have blessed him and will make him fruitful and will multiply him exceedingly. He shall father twelve princes, and I will make him a great nation. And I will establish My covenant with Isaac, whom Sarah shall bear to you at this set apart time next year."

He finished talking with him. And Elohim ascended up from Abraham.

Abram means "exulted Father" and **Abraham** means "father of many"
Sarai and **Sarah** mean "princess", but the name Sarah shows she will be a mother of nations and kings.

Israel Fun Facts:

What is the Difference Between a Cistern and a Well?

A cistern and a well both supply water, but each have a different purpose.

In ancient Israel, the summer months could be very hot and dry and the people needed a place to store water. Workers would dig a large hole in the ground and carve into solid rock to form a **cistern** to catch rainwater. This was a man-made reservoir used to store large amounts of "standing" water that could serve an entire community. Many old cisterns have been discovered by archaeologists throughout the land of Israel and Jerusalem.

During the times of the Bible kings the walls of a cistern would be covered in plaster to keep the water from seeping out. However, even the cisterns covered with plaster would eventually break down and develop cracks causing all the water to seep out.

The larger cisterns built deep underground were also used for places to hide, to hold prisoners and also used as burial places. Jeremiah the prophet was thrown into a mud pit and held as prisoner in a broken down cistern which held no water (Jerm. 38:6).

A **well** also provided water, but in a different way than a cistern. A well was dug to tap into a supply of "living" groundwater, such as a stream or natural spring. This water was safe to drink. Ropes and a bucket were lowered into the well to bring up the water from the well.

The Bible tells of other important events which happened at a well. Jacob kissed Rachel at the well (Gen. 29:11) and Isaac's wife Rebekah was found at the well drawing water for camels (Gen. 23:7-22). Abraham dug a well in in Beer-Sheva (which means The Well of the oath) and cut a covenant with Abimelech there. This well today can still be found in Beer-Sheva.




HEBREW LESSON

The **Resh** is the **Twentieth Letter** of the Hebrew Alphabet. It takes the "R" sound as in really or right.

(Cow) **Pahrah - פרה**

In this word the Resh would take the "A" sound because of the Kammats vowel underneath.

(Wall) **Keer - קיר**

In this word the Resh would take the normal "R" sound as in door.

(Shepherd) **Row'eh - רועה**

In this word the Resh would take the "Ro" sound because of the kholam vowel above the vav.

 This vowel point is called a "Koo boots." It takes an "O" and it gives the "OO" sound as in food.

The Lizard you can take with the hands, yet it is in the king's palaces. How is this wise? The lizard is small and yet he can get into the well-guarded palace of a king!




What do these four little and wise things teach us?

There are a few people who are named after how they act, Abigail's husband was named Nabal which means fool as he acted foolishly against David, 1 Samuel 25:25.


Yahshua also changed the names of some of the apostles when he called Simon, Peter. rock. Some people changed their own names as Shaul became Paul.
