Preschool: I can't believe we are already half way through April! We only have a few weeks left of school. I will send balances home this week for the remainder of the year. Please pay these over our final weeks. We will continue to work on our names. We have made some great progress! This week we will work on the letters 'G' and 'K'. Talk with your student about some things in your house that begin with these letters. Talking with kids increases their language development. Ask them questions while they are doing routine things at home like putting on their shoes and getting dressed. Talk with them about left and right. This will help with reading and comprehension down the road. Dress appropriately this week. It looks like winter is trying to make a comeback! Have a wonderful week! - Miss Stacie

Kind: This week my students will be working on S blends. We will be finding words that start and end with s, and we will work on sounding them out. Students will also have a review week in math. We will be going back over all of the 3D shapes, reviewing short story problems, and we will be working on adding dimes and pennies together. Students will go over how to measure temperature and continue to work on how to use a ruler to measure lines. Our word of the week this week is "miniature". Please continue to work on sight/spelling words at home. It is important for students to know previous test words and continue to build their vocabulary knowledge. Let's have another great week! - Miss Rachel

1st/2nd: This week we will be celebrating Earth Day on Thursday. First grade will continue working on identifying sentences and they have a larger spelling list this week, so please be studying those nightly. They will also have a science test on Wednesday. Second grade is working on alphabetizing words this week and understanding homophones. They will also be writing poems this week using rhyming words. Second grade will have a states quiz on Thursday and a science test on Friday. We are nearing the end of the year, but we are still working hard. Have a great week. - Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: The days are dwindling down and summer break is right around the corner. Our class needs to remain focused and finish strong. This morning we had Star testing. Third grade will have a math test on Tuesday and fourth grade will have one on Wednesday. Third grade will also have a science test over chapter 13 on Thursday. We will finish MAP Testing this week. Tuesday, we will test in the afternoon and Wednesday we will test in the morning. Please make sure your student gets plenty of sleep and has a good breakfast. 5th/6th: 5th grade is practicing for their physical fitness test during part of their recess each day. They have goals to run a mile in 13 minutes, sit-ups G-32, B-37, push-ups G-7, B-8 and pull-ups G-1, B-1.

5th and 6th, 7th and 8th grades continue to work in C.A.R.S. and Buckle Down books. These books feature a reading selection with questions about the passages. 5th is reading Chapter 18 in Science and Chapter 4 in Social Studies. 6th grade is reading Chapter 4 in Science and will begin Ancient Greece. 7th and 8th grades are reading stories from their Literature books and taking selection tests over the material. All the reading and questions are focused on helping students with their MAP testing. - Mrs. Sewell

5-8 Math: In addition to all grades finishing up MAP and EOC testing in math, 5th grade is working on reducing and simplifying fractions and doing longer divisions. Sixth grade is working on understanding vocabulary related to angle measures and turns and working with various geometric formulas. In seventh grade, students are working with compound probability and volume of more complex shapes. In pre-algebra, students are working with financial concepts of mark-up, profit, and commission. In algebra, students are multiplying rational expressions and looking at nonlinear functions.

Tests this Week: 5th, 6th, 7th, and Pre-Algebra: Thursday

7-8: Eighth grade will be MAP testing in science this week. Around that, they will finish up a chapter on the levels of classification. Seventh grade will be finishing up a chapter on disease and the body's immune response. In social studies, eighth grade will hit the Civil War while seventh grade will hit World War II. We will continue our unit on clauses, including both independent and subordinate clauses and strategies to distinguish compound sentences from complex sentences. **Tests this Week: 7th and 8th Science: Tuesday - Mr. Ewing**
