1. Print and cut out all the game cards in this template.
2. Glue the back of each card to colored paper or card stock.

Each person will turn over two cards and if they match put them aside. Then the next person will try.

While thinking about good manners, the goal is to remember where the matching cards are to make a complete pair! You can also play this game alone.

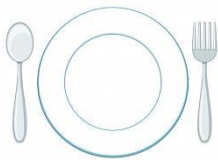

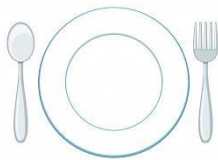
