Restored relationships

April 11th 2021


The last year has put pressure on relationships like never before. Even in the best of times there are a multitude of reasons why human relationships flourish, falter or fail. In difficult and testing times those reasons become even more pressing and at times overwhelming. We all know that restoring a faltering relationship can be very tricky indeed. How can relationships be restored? What about the relationship between Jesus and the apostles which was abruptly interrupted by Jesus' arrest, trial and crucifixion?

On the evening of the first Easter Day the disciples were hiding from the Jews and an extraordinary thing happened: Jesus came and stood among them. I wonder what they thought he would say. Would he reproach them for deserting him when things got really difficult? But he said *'Peace be with you'*. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord. This really was a new beginning for them. Jesus welcomed them unconditionally and, because of that, their relationship to him was restored. Jesus completely changed their lives. As indeed encounters with Christ today and a new relationship with Him still change the lives of those who turn to Him in faith.

But Thomas wasn't there and he wasn't going to believe a word of it. Like many today, if he were to have faith Thomas wanted evidence. A week later Thomas was with the disciples. Jesus came and said 'reach out your hand and put it in my side'. The moment of decision has come for Thomas: 'stop doubting and believe', says Jesus. His doubting was the obstacle to a restored relationship with Jesus and Jesus challenges him. He was awestruck: 'My Lord and my God'. Thomas saw and believed. At that point he entered into a new and personal relationship with Jesus. He trusted Jesus with his life in a new way. Jesus says 'Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed'. I guess we are a bit like that when we trust in Jesus. For us it is not just agreeing with the facts; it is entering into a new and personal relationship with our Lord and Saviour.

There may be times when we drift away from Jesus when other concerns take over, when

our love for him grows cold, when our relationship with him is not all that it might be or should be. But Jesus is always ready to welcome us back. He could easily have written Thomas off but he didn't. Thomas was challenged and called by Jesus to faith just as we are. Thomas responded and said 'My Lord and my God'. May we be those who in all the uncertainties we face likewise respond 'My Lord and my God'. By his Spirit may he be as real to us as he was to Thomas, and day by day may we know and experience the reality of his love for us and a living relationship with him.
