### National Senior Citizen's Day is August 21<sup>st</sup>!

Do you have an elderly person in your life that you love and appreciate? August 21 —National Senior Citizens Day — is the day to let them know how much you care about them. Our senior citizens have contributed so much to our communities and helped make them what they are today. National Senior Citizens Day is the day to show them our appreciation and support and recognize their accomplishments. It's also a time to help raise awareness of various issues that affect senior citizens. ### Community Service Update

Our community service quilt project for Diversicare of Oxford is coming along. We are past the halfway mark on our goal of 50 quilts. There are 30 completely finished quilts and about 6 that are ready for binding. There are more quilts that are almost read to be turned in. The goal is to have all of the quilts finished by the end of September. Quilt labels, with the Lick Skillet logo, to go on the backs of each quilt are here and the plan is to sew those on at the August 17<sup>th</sup> Sew Day. If you have completed quilts ready, please bring them to either this month's meeting or to the sew day.

The quilt size is roughly 45x45 with a flannel back. They should be pieced and quilted to last through regular use. I just wanted to share a heart-warming story with each of you on quilts like we are making for residents of the nursing home.

Several years back, my favorite uncle had a heart attack while away from home. After weeks in a hospital with fairly limited visits from family, he was moved to a nursing home. I made him a lap quilt very much like the ones we are making this year as part of our community service project. When I delivered it, he grinned, unfolded it, and covered his lap with it. He told me it was just what he needed when he needed it. His weight loss after a month in the hospital made him cold all the time. He was limited to a wheel chair and the small size of the quilt fit perfectly when tucked around his legs. Everyone who saw it commented on how perfectly it fit his personality. It brought him joy for the 2 remaining weeks of life that he had.

We should never ever hesitate to do a kindness. Some of the people who will receive these lap quilts have family to look in on them. Others do not. These quilts will serve as a reminder that someone cared enough to make something that brightens their day and warms their limbs.

Thank you all for the work you are doing on these quilts.
