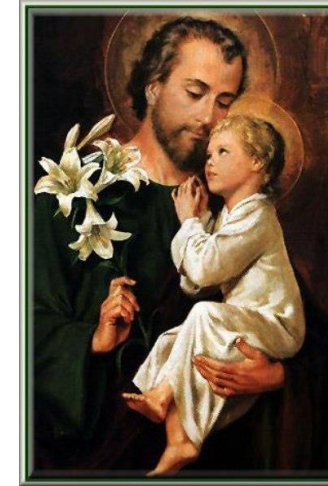

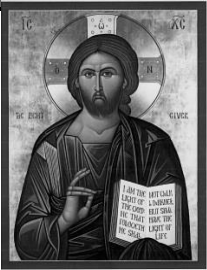

Saturday of the 11th Week in Ordinary Time- Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary
Homily- June 18, 2016

Today’s Mass: Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary Readings: 2 Chronicles 24:17-25
Matthew 6:24-34

Blessed Teresa of Calcutta once said,

“The greatness of our Lady was in her humility. No wonder Jesus, who lived so close to her, seemed so anxious that we learn from him and from her but one lesson: to be meek and humble of heart.”

We are all familiar with the perennial Christmas classic, *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens. An outstanding example of someone who serves mammon, someone anxious about his possessions, is the miser from that classic, Ebenezer Scrooge. Worry about material things blinded his vision, hardened his heart, and put a stronghold on his ability to love. Scrooge could not see the world around him because he focused on money.

English author and Anglican clergyman William Ralph Inge said, “Worry is interest paid trouble before it comes due.” Think about that...

Jesus offers us an antidote to the poison of worry; he advised his disciples to be fully devoted to God and put their trust in the Father’s providential care.

Jesus was not promoting idleness or laziness. He was insisting on priority and trust. His disciples must put dedication to the kingdom above anxiety about possessions. Anxiety is a sign of weak faith.

Today’s lesson suggests that we do inventory—not of our list of possessions but of our level of trust. Scrooge’s “Bah, humbug” is appropriately addressed to our anxiety and fears and greed. Tiny Tim had it right: “God bless us everyone!”
Jesus, I trust in you!
