### Scarlet Runner Bean Plants

Currently in our programs we do not have any children with allergies to peanuts. However, we do have a child with a severe allergy to tree nuts, including almonds, walnuts, cashews, pistachios, chestnuts and

However, we will still be checking for the ingredients listed above, and items which "may contain tree nuts" and send home a reminder that tree nuts pose a health risk.
