Or even after you die!

What and How? Well, if you leave something to the parish (or the diocese) in your will, it takes effect after you die. It's worth a thought.

We got a letter from Father Andrew O'Sullivan - formerly of this parish - on the virus and how it is affecting collections in the diocese.(Father O'Sullivan is with the Office for Financial Development as well as having parish responsibilities.) He reports that the Common Fund collection at Mass is down 68% between March and September, and the Share collection is down 75%.

Some families are undergoing dramatic reductions in income. Your parish clergy and the diocese are very grateful to parishioners who contribute in spite of the difficulties: reduced income for many, and no access (for the time being) to Mass. The parish church is open for private prayer (in the side aisle) after daily and Sunday Mass: the table at the back of the church has donation envelopes available for the weekly collections, and also Harvest Dues and November Dead List envelopes.

We had temporary arrangements for blocking off some of the pews in the church for social distancing - red/white plastic tape. The semi-permanent is replacing the temporary! More elegant rope replaces the basic plastic tape, thanks to a donation by non-parishioners. We hope to complete the replacement this weekend.

Another donation! We have a new webcam which I hope improves the experience of on-line attendance at Mass.
