


BOARD MEMBER AT LARGE JOZEY KEITH





ELAINE RAMSTEAD



LEGISLATIVE SYMPOSIUM WASHINGTON DC

Attending the Legislative Symposium was all I could have imagined and more. The few short days Linda and I spent in Washington, D.C. were jam packed, and I'm still surprised so much happened in such a short amount of time. Our first day arriving, we planned on getting in as much sight-seeing as possible. Unfortunately, mechanical issues with our plane delayed our flight and we missed out on most of that day. However, we still managed to squeeze in time throughout the trip to check out some of the monuments and more notable buildings (Lincoln memorial, the White House, Capitol Hill, and more!) in the afternoons. The second day was a crash-course on the political climate in D.C. along with what Legislation was particularly pressing for ASCLS delegates to share opinions on with state representatives in Congress. Then, the next day, we "stormed the Hill." We met with Legislative Assistants who were very attentive listeners. We urged them to let our Congressmen know that we want them to; Propose an Allied Health Workforce Shortage Act that will hopefully help with replacing our ever dwindling workforce, mend issues with PAMA affecting reimbursement in the lab, and support VALID in order to give lab developed testing proper regulation. Hopefully they will take our proposals and put them into action. I am grateful to ASCLS for giving me the opportunity to be a voice and advocate for our profession.






