Preschool: We have fun activities planned for our 100th day today! This week we will work on counting to 30 and identifying numbers up to 10. Our names are coming along. Please continue to practice at home. We have been working a lot with colors and shapes. We have been sorting them and identifying them by playing bingo. When you drive in the car, ask your child, if they see any shapes or colors. This will help students identify them in the real world. Don't forget! Valentine's Day boxes need to be here by February 14th! GO CHIEFS!!! - Miss Stacie

Kind: We made it to 100 days of school! Today we focused on 100, tomorrow we will focus on 101. However, our theme this week is snakes. Our vocabulary words are molt, hibernate, predators, prey, pupil, and scutes. During phonics, we will focus on /ng/ and /ing/. Please do not forget about spirit week! We are excited to dress up and participate.

1st/2nd: Welcome, February! In 1st grade we are diving into volcanoes (not literally), but we will read nonfiction texts about volcanoes and be able to write supportive details to explain how volcanoes work. In grammar we will introduce adverbs and antonyms. In math we will be working on counting by 10's starting from any number (Our hundred charts will come in handy. There is a quick and simple way to learn how to do this and it provides a great visual for the students. We will also work on ordering numbers up to 100 from least to greatest. These are key words to recognize and learn in math. In 2nd grade we will be reading the story Each Kindness by Jacqueline Woodson. We will be making observations and analyzing as we read. We will break down different parts of the story to read between the lines. In grammar we will be working on different ways to spell /ee/ at the end of words and continue working on making them plural. In math we will continue working on subtracting, but now we are subtracting 2-digit numbers. We will also start multiplying by 10 (10 x 7=70). Both grades will have a spelling test Wednesday. Have a great week! - Mrs. Thomas

3rd/4th: Happy 100th Day of School! We are on the downhill slide now! This week, math class will look a little different Third grade will have a math test on Tuesday and then both grades will be working in our STAMS (Strategies To Achieve Mathematics Success) Solve books. The work in these books will allow us to dig a little deeper into each concept that would appear on our MAP test this spring. Students will be working on these in class and they will be getting grades for their work. We will have our regular spelling tests on Friday. Fourth grade will have a science test on Thursday over

chapter 11. In Social Studies, students will be going over week 17 in their Missouri Studies Weekly. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 5th and 6th grade will be finishing their Haiku and Diamond poems this week. They will also be working on their Cereal Box Book Reports. In Science, 5th grade will have a test over Ch. 13 on Friday and 6th grade will continue reading about the properties of sound. In Social Studies, 5th grade will start a new chapter over the Civil War and 6th grade will start a new unit over Ancient Mesopotamia. 5th grade will have a label Central America test on Friday.

7th / 8th Comm. Arts: Students will be reviewing figurative language this week and will have a test over the ones listed in their packets this Friday. Students will also be working on their Book Talks that they will present next Mon., Feb. 13th and Tues., Feb. 14th. Have a great week! – Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students will be looking at the difference between prime and composite numbers, reducing fractions, and answering questions based on various data displays. In sixth grade, students are working with story problems related to ratio, operations with measurements, and will be learning about angle bisectors. **Tests This Week:** 5th Math: Tuesday, 6th Math: Wednesday **7/8:** In science, we will be moving back into our respective units. Seventh grade is learning about the history and technology of space exploration. Eighth grade is learning about cell life processes. In social studies, seventh grade is learning about various democratic revolutions throughout history. Eighth grade is learning about the early 19th century and the War of 1812. Soon, we will begin preparing for our study of the constitution. I will take this opportunity to inform/remind, as the case may be, that students are required to pass the constitution exams by the state of Missouri. **Tests This Week:** 7/8 Social Studies: Weds., 7/8 Science: Friday & 7th Math: Weds.
