Welcome A New Board Member

We welcome another new member to the DAS Board, Jamie Schubert. Here is her answer to the question "What led you to join and participate in the Dixie Archaeology Society"?

I grew up in the SF Bay Area and graduated from UC Berkeley in geography. I spent my working life as a cartographer, first with the USGS and then with BIA. You may have used one of the 7.5' topo maps I helped to make. My work moved me around to many locations in the West. I spent protracted lengths of time in Lakewood, CO and Sacramento, CA. I retired to St. George in 2016.

Back in the 90s, I used to do Sierra Club service trips. On one of these trips to Chaco Canyon, I met an NPS archaeologist named Tom Windes. He needed occasional help from a mapper on his summer field projects. I signed up and ended up working with his volunteer field crew every summer for the past 20 summers. I have worked with him in Mesa Verde NP, Aztec Nat Mon, Bears Ears Nat Mon, and many other smaller and obscure archaeological sites in the 4-corners area. He specialized in collecting samples for dendro-chronological dating.

When I came to St George I saw a notice about the Dixie Archaeological Society and decided to check it out. Since I knew more about prehistoric architecture than rock art, I found a new field to explore. I had been treasurer of volunteer non-profits in the past, so I decided it couldn't be that hard to be treasurer of the Rock Art group. And here I am on the Board.
