# Whate Happening in Class...

PreK

We are learning the letter sounds and talking about the leaves changing colors. We are also recognizing the numbers 1-10.



# 1st Grade

First grade is learning different consonant digraphs, sight words and

started to practice reading short vowel books. We are learning different addition and problem solving strategies. We memorized John 3:16 and we sing it as a song as well. We continue to make gospel bracelets twice a week for our service project. We had an



awesome turn out from Family Fair. We are doing it throughout the school year. We also have a new teacher aide, Mrs. Brown, who we are so excited to have!

# 3rd Grade

Third grade is studying figurative language, developing comprehension and will start our first novel when we return from Thanksgiving, Charlotte's Web. We are still working on becoming Masters of Multiplication while doing hands-on



learning, memorization and writing them out. We have also started our Spiritual Works of Mercy ministry by designing and writing condolence cards and baptism cards for our parish family. This includes Bible verse studies for each. We are also connecting religion and faith into Science, History and Art.

## 5th Grade

October has been a busy month for the BRATZ!!!! We have left the Swamp of Long Division and entered the Forest of Fractions, where we will be camping for a few months. We celebrated Dr. C's birthday by making a volcano in a pumpkin, and we're making



progress in writing our explanatory papers. We are studying the Sacrament of Baptism in religion and just completed a close look at the role of the Catholic Church in the colonization of the Americas as part of our discussion on Columbus. We are already ready for Thanksgiving because we are learning about the Pilgrims and Puritans and the creation of the original 13 English colonies! The feast day of our room saint, St. Jude, is October 28th, so we have been learning more about this very popular saint. Fifth grade rocks!!!

### Kindergarten

Kindergarten is working hard on learning phonics and sight words to be able to read. They are expanding their vocabu-

lary by learning new words and applying them. We are also learning characters, setting, and event as well as reading comprehension skills. We are learning measuring, graphing, and less than/greater than.



We enjoy cutting, gluing and being creative. We love individual prayers and expanding our knowledge about God.

## 2nd Grade

Second grade is learning about the 9 fruits of the spirit. We are also reading a Realistic Fiction, Sled Dogs Run. We have been researching our Saint for All Saints Day



on November 1st and studying for our Spelling Bee.

# 4th Grade

In religion, 4th grade will begin a new unit, The Reality of Sin and the Necessity of Virtue where we will dive more into what sin means, the differences be-



tween venial and mortal sins, mercy and forgiveness, God's Covenants and virtue. In the end, we will build off of what we learned in October about our conscience choices and morals. In math, we are starting a new unit of multiplication with multiple digits, regrouping, rounding and estimations. In reading, we are having fun with the genre, dramas and animal stories. For Language Arts, we are building our reading and rewriting skills by focusing on punctuation, sentence structure and paragraph writing. In Social Studies, we will be nearing testing on our US states, capitals and state abbreviations and in Science we are going to learn about plant and animal cells and classifying animals. Students are taking advantage of the cooler weather at recess and continuing to get out for PE. Fourth grade is actively involved in altar serving and lecturing as well as weekly choir. We are getting in some fall art with coloring and putting together fall books and we will get to do a fabric autumn pumpkin.
