Tuition Payment Policy

• Tuition payments are due on or before the first (1st) day of each month.

- Failure to make tuition payments on time may incur late fee charges, \$5.00/day to a maximum of \$50.00.
- Fees can be paid, in the method of Direct Debit, Visa, MC or Amex., cheque, EMT transactions, cash. Failure to make payment will void contractual agreement.
- A charge of \$45.00 will be levied against all N.S.F. cheques or cheques returned for any reason.
- There are no refunds for mid-program withdrawals, holidays, sick days, or days missed for any other reason throughout services with MONTESSORINNOVATIONS INC. O/A Polkadots Playland & Montessori Centre.
- Tuition is paid for education services delivered between 9am and 4pm daily. Children must be picked up on time.
- Extended Care is offered daily from 7am to 9am and 4pm to 6pm, students enrolled in before or after-school extended care, will pay separately for care services.

Illness Policy

COVID - 19 Parameters

MINISTRY OF HEALTH GUIDANCE:

With continued COVID-19 requirements the following precautions and practices will be in place:

- Protective Equipment for ALL staff
 - Masks. (Not mandated but strongly recommended)
 - uniform
 - gloves (when food handling or engaging with students' sanitation)
- All staff and students are expected to practice:
 - Physical distancing when possible
 - Proper cough and sneeze etiquette
 - Frequent hand washing
 - Cleaning and disinfectants of high traffic surfaces
 - Staying at home when ill
 - All staff have received 2 doses of an approved Covid-19 Vaccine
- Reduced numbers and Ratios creating limited groups of 15:
 - 15 students /classroom with 2 Staff (Maximum capacity)
 - School groups rotate through the playground space individually
 - Students may continue to wear masks during play sessions, group activities, and during class time where physical distancing cannot be maintained. This is an individual choice families will make
- Routine hand washing routines before and after meals and play sessions
- Increased cleaning and disinfecting routine: As per Public Health recommendations
 - High traffic areas will be cleaned 2 times daily
 - Classrooms will be cleaned 2 times daily
 - Bathrooms will be cleaned 2 times daily (intermittently as required)
 - Eating areas will be disinfected before and after meals

Developed by Italian educator and doctor, **Maria Montessori** after extensive research with special needs children in the early years of the twentieth century, the method contains five basic principles:

Principle 1: Respect for the Child

Respect for the Child is the major principle underlying the entire Montessori method.

Respect is shown for children by giving students the freedom to make choices, to do things for themselves, and to learn for themselves. Respect is also shown by not interrupting their concentration. Teachers model desired and expected behaviour like respect, peaceful conflict resolution, emotional regulation and etiquette.

Principle 2: The Absorbent Mind

Montessori education is based on the principle that, simply by living, children are constantly learning from the world around them. Through their senses children constantly absorb information from their world. They then make sense of it because they are thinking beings.

Principle 3: Sensitive Periods

Montessori pedagogy believes there are certain periods during which children are more ready to learn certain skills. These are known as sensitive periods, and last only as long as is necessary for the child to acquire the skills. The order in which sensitive periods occur (e.g. sensitive period for writing) as well as the timing of the period varies for each child. Through observation, Montessori teachers must identify sensitive periods in their students and provide the resources for children to flourish during this time.

Principle 4: The Prepared Environment

The Montessori method suggests that children learn best in an environment that has been prepared to enable them to do things for themselves. Always child-centred, the learning environment promotes freedom for children to explore materials of their choice. Teachers should prepare the learning environment by making materials and experiences available to children in an orderly and independent way.

Principle 5: Auto education

Auto education, or self-education, is the concept that children are capable of

educating themselves. This is one of the most important beliefs in the Montessori method.

Montessori teachers provide the environment, the inspiration, the guidance and the encouragement for children to educate themselves.

The Role of the Teacher

In Montessori education the role of the teacher is to guide children in their learning without becoming an obstacle, and without inserting themselves too much into the natural learning process. Therefore, the Montessori teacher is a facilitator, not a lecturer. Montessori teachers encourage children to learn by placing the student, rather than the teacher, at the centre of the experience. They provide learning materials appropriate to each child after close observation in the specially prepared learning environment. Teachers also demonstrate and model learning activities whilst providing freedom for the students to learn in their own way. Montessori teachers manage classroom behaviours by modelling ongoing respect for all children and their work, by observing and using sensitive periods, interests and abilities, to plan activity, and by diverting inappropriate behaviour to meaningful tasks. The teacher's role is to respect the freedom of each child to forge his or her own unique path of learning and personal growth, energized by his or her natural curiosity. We are committed to inspire and encourage each child to take in hand a wealth of activities and experiences to ensure successful development. Teachers prepare lesson plans as a guide to ensure that the students are participating in all areas of the class, however, they remain flexible and respectful of the child's need to make choices and decisions in their daily activities.

Multi-age classrooms

One of the more widely known features of a Montessori education is that of the multiage classroom. Rejecting the notion all children of the same age develop and progress at the same pace, Montessori schools believe multi-age classrooms enable children to work more productively at their natural pace. Montessori classrooms are typically set up in 3-year age ranges. Advocates believe this enable children to learn better social skills, and to develop academically, in a co-operative, non-competitive learning environment. We encourage the students to communicate and engage in cooperative play/work by supporting their ability to self-regulate and by providing a mix-age group setting where the students remain with the same teachers for three years. This allows for the opportunity to build relationships and to interact with the peers that are younger and older than the student, and with the adults.

The Montessori classroom

Montessori believed that the learning environment (including teachers, experiences and the physical environment) may either positively or negatively impact the self-education of the child. Thus, Montessori classrooms are set up in such a way as to best facilitate and encourage learning. This prepared environment consists of 5 Montessori Areas of study; each offering students a variety of sensory based learning opportunities. The specifically designed Montessori materials allow for exploration and they encourage students to become independent, yet also promote the concept of teamwork. The classroom allows for the freedom of movement and for the development of a positive work cycle, by allowing the students to choose their activities and to explore with them without interruption.
