Preschool: We have arrived at the last week of April. This year has truly flown by! The weather will finally feel like spring this week, so we may venture outside for a little extra time. This week we will work on letters "O" and "I". We will work with scissors this week and cutting on lines. We will build our finger strength by cutting playdough too! We have enjoyed playing color and shape bingo! This has helped us learn our shapes. This week we will play Alphabet Bingo. Have a great last week of April! - Miss Stacie

Kind: This week my class will be reviewing blends we have learned so far. I will send a list of blends home for homework. Students should identify these blends for their parents a couple of times this week. We will also continue to add sight words to our sight word list. Please use the sight word list sent home at midterms to identify which words your child needs to work on. Remember, these words are also the spelling words. For math we will be focusing on subtraction and addition problems, along with continuing to practice on what numbers we can add together to make ten. Students will also complete a couple assignments this week on what they think are characteristics of a role model. We will be using their answers to guide a class discussion on how we can be role models. Our word of the week is "crease". - Miss Rachel

1st/2nd: This week first grade will be discussing matter and the forms it takes on, as well as how to describe matter. First grade will also be working hard on their math skills as they continue preparing for second grade. Please make sure you are practicing counting dimes, nickels and pennies with your child at home and continue practicing their math facts.

They do have flashcards to practice. Second grade will be discussing properties of matter this week with a more detailed look at each of the three states and how they can use these to describe various objects in the world. We will continue our discussion on the pioneers and the Indians in social studies and will have a states quiz on Tuesday to cover the states we know thus far. Second grade has compound words for spelling words this week, so make sure you are practicing these each night. I am so proud of how quickly second grade has been learning their multiplication facts and hope they continue to practice. **Remember AR tests are due by May 7th.** Your child should know what they still need to complete. 3rd/4th: With soccer season winding down and baseball/softball season just getting started, I am sure, like mine, your evenings are pretty busy. I want to continue to push forward and finish out the year strong. Our class will continue to review basic grammar fundamentals. Students will have extra practice work to help fine tune this subject area. On Wednesday, 3rd grade will have a math test and 4th grade will have a science test over chapter 13. On Thursday, 4th grade will have a math test and both grades will have a history test over chapter 8. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: 5th and 6th graders will start daily Geography practice this week. In Science, 5th grade will finish Ch. 18 and prepare for a test next week. 6th graders will finish Ch. 4 and test next week as well. In English, both grades will review punctuation and prepositions. In Reading, students will finish their C.A.R.S. and Buckledown workbooks. In Social Studies, 5th grade will continue reading about the Civil War and 6th grade will look at Ancient Greece.

7th/8th Comm. Arts: Students will work on a Shakespeare scavenger hunt today and will perform a Reader's Theater of "The Taming of the Shrew". They will also continue working through Buckledown workbooks and will look at argument and persuasion in their Literature textbooks. Have a wonderful week! - Mrs. Foster

7th-8th: All eighth graders will be taking a Communication Arts EOC, and we will be practicing this week. In health, seventh grade is looking at the dangers of tobacco addiction, while the eighth grade is working on environmental safety issues such as pollution. In social studies, seventh grade is currently looking at events which happened during the Cold War, while eighth grade continues to look at events which divided the nation and lead to the Civil War. **Display Boards for Science Projects are due on Wednesday.** Tests this Week: 7th/8th Social Studies: Friday

5-8 Math: All MAP and EOC tests in math have been completed. In fifth grade, students are working on simplifying fractions and doing long division problems. Sixth grade is working on harder problems involving order of operations and decimal/fraction/percent conversions. In seventh grade, students are working on scale factor and the Pythagorean Theorem. In pre-algebra, students are working on concepts of profit, commission, and probability. In algebra, students are working on systems of equations based on uniform motion in both directions.
