Featured Dojo

This month we are featuring the Palmer Shotokan Karate Club. Sensei Becky Knowlton is the instructor, and has been teaching and training for over 10 years.

The Palmer Shotokan Karate Club by Sensei Becky Knowlton



I still vividly remember my first karate class with Sensei Sharon Dean in January of 1997. I was the only adult in a sea of 6-year old little boys. And I was in trouble before class even started for coming onto the floor wearing socks. The story of the Palmer Shotokan Karate Club begins in 1987 with Sharon, then a purple belt, teaching through the community schools program. The club trained in the cafeteria of the Palmer Middle School. In 1998 the Palmer Club closed its doors and I began commuting to Eagle River to train

In 2004, two of the Eagle River karate families announced plans to move to the Valley, and an idea was launched to re-open the Palmer Club. We began in September at one of the school district gyms with seven students.

In January of 2005 we had the opportunity to move to a new dance studio on the Palmer-Wasilla Highway, and word of mouth quickly swelled our ranks. By 2007 I was teaching three classes a night and we had still outgrown our space.

It fascinates me how cycles work in our lives. Just about the time I was forced to begin looking for new space for the club, I was also at a point in my life where I was trying to decide what I wanted to do next. And the idea sprouted that maybe we could form a non-profit organization, similar to AMAC, for the Valley. We have a strong possibility on the horizon, and could be moving into a brand new space as early as spring of 2009.

The Mat-Su Martial Arts Center will focus on filling the need for adult education and community space by offering classroom/meeting rooms, as well as the martial arts studio space, for rent to the public. The Palmer Club was created under the community schools program and this would be a way we can give back to the community and help fill a gap in local services.

Meanwhile, the Palmer Karate Club has been very active and supportive. The club continues to grow, both in numbers and in team unity. We have our first crop of homegrown 1kyus preparing for their Dan test.

Oh, and as for Sharon Dean. She went on to earn her Yondan with ISKF before moving to Utah in 2002, ostensibly to retire. That didn't last very long. She discovered a tae kwon do club there, and earned her black belt. Then she went to Monterey, CA, and moved into the jujutsu dojo in Monterey as a full-time student! She has now attained her sixth degree black belt in jujutsu and is teaching and training full-time. She's delighted to hear the Palmer Club is succeeding and sends everyone in Alaska her fondest wishes.
