Motorcycle Sport is one of the most exciting things you'll ever be involved with.

If slamming whoops, carving berms and flying high over jumps is your idea of fun, then Motorcross is the Sport for you. Motocross is one of the most popular off-road sports in the country. It is run on tracks shaped from natural terrain and produces fast, close and exciting racing.

## **Club History**

The Top End Motocross club was formed in 1998 to meet the needs of Darwin's young motorcycle riders who at that stage, had no organised facility to utilise. Since this time the club has continued to grow to its current stage of some 300+ members and boasts a facility which includes 3 tracks (natural terrain, motocross and mini bike), clubrooms including canteen facilities, shaded spectator areas and ancillary facilities to assist the function of the club, members and spectators alike. This facility is the Campbell Park Motocross Complex located on Catalina Road, Palmerston.

Motocross is a sport that continues to grow in Australia with increasing licence holders participating in organised events across the country. Darwin has seen this trend continue with membership continuing to grow. The club hosts regular race meetings throughout the year and also allows access to the facility all year round for training, coaching and practicing.

Motocross forms part of the Motorsports NT calendar and the club is affiliated with both Motorsports NT and Motorcycling Australia who contribute and assist the club to maintain a safe and controlled environment for all participants – from 4 years of age through to veteran and master class riders.

## Purpose

The purpose of the club is to continue to provide a safe and controlled facility for all users. This is achieved under the guidance and control of Motorcycling Australia (the sport's governing body in Australia). As previously mentioned, the club facilities are well utilised and the club assists the local community to control the amount of illegal dirt bike riding especially in junior age riders. This in itself is a win for the club and continues to motivate the club to provide further events and activities at the facilities including coaching days provided by visiting eastern states coaches.

## **President's Report**

#### Welcome All!

It is my pleasure to deliver my report as President of Top End Motocross Club for 2020.

Firstly I would like to express my thanks to the 2020 Committee through what was been a difficult year for many.

2020 started off strong for TEMCC but as with all motorsport organization COVID-19 impacted our ability to run due to face to face interactions and federal government restrictions in place.

The goals we had for 2020 were to develop the Campbell Park Complex into a national MA standard facility with tracks to develop our Junior and Senior riders to enable them to compete interstate, at National titles and events.

Both these goals have been accomplished with the complex been finished and now weatherproof. In addition, all TEMCC tracks have now been licenced without requiring TRA's to be completed before usage of them.

Another goal was to implement a TEMCC junior development program this was put on hold due to COVID-19, travel restrictions and having only 5 months of riding available.


Despite the turmoil of COVID-19, TEMCC was able to eventually reopen with our first event during held of the 17<sup>th</sup> May 20 and deliver the new inception of Ride Park Days Australia in the NT as well as being the first held Australia wide with over 70 participants.

As of the 1<sup>st</sup> July, Motorcycling Australia allowed NT clubs to commence competitive racing TEMCC held their first round of the Allan King & Sons Mr MX Series on the 11<sup>th</sup> July which saw over 65 competitors ride the newly created 2km track.

This shorten season still saw our club hold 5 ride park days, 6 rounds of competitive racing and over 20 practices with inexperienced new riders returning to ride the MX and NT tracks numerous times over the 6 month period.

All of this was made possible by the hard work of so many volunteers but in particular our 2020 committee. A special thanks to Daniel Thorneycroft, Luke Skillington and Nathan Westaway who spent many long hours at the track to prepare and water before race meets, without volunteers like these three we would not have been about to race upon a well maintained and groomed track as we have this season. Lastly, I want to thank you as the members of TEMCC for your engagement and participation in events and member consultation as this is what drives our sport, the committee and myself.

I look forward to seeing the next committee working into the "new normal" of 2021 and continuing to strength the MX community so that TEMCC can grow and support our riders into the future.
