Uncharted Territory

The Lord went in front of them in a pillar of cloud by day, to lead them along the way, and in a pillar of fire by night, to give them light, so that they might travel by day and by night. Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night left its place in front of the people.

2021 has, at last, arrived. All of us, or at least the vast majority of us, have been longing for the new year to come. The promise of vaccines and the eventual return to something approaching normal was a hope that we've been looking towards, and I for one found it a huge help in maintaining my spirits in the last few months of 2020.

Now, though, we are in 2021 – and we haven't reached the Promised Land yet. In fact, at times we may seem further from it than we've been before. As infections continue to be widespread in our area and delays in vaccine availability frustrate us, we can be forgiven if we respond with a degree of despondency. When will we be able to travel without fear? When will we be able to hug our grandkids freely? When will we be able to take our masks off and sing on Sunday morning? The honest answer is, we don't know.

We are in uncharted territory, my friends — and uncharted territory can be scary with its unknowns and unfamiliarity. Yet we are not the first to enter uncharted territory. The Israelites who fled slavery in Egypt to seek their own Promised Land had never been there. Moses hadn't either. They knew there were obstacles on the way, and at times they cowered in fear. But they pushed forward. Why? Because God was with them. God was guiding them. God saw their struggles and walked with them through the wilderness. And though it took longer than they imagined, the people of Israel eventually got to the Promised Land. It wasn't like life had been — it wasn't like it was back in Egypt — but it was the life God desired for them, a life together in the presence of God.

We don't know yet what 2021 will bring, or how long it will take us to reach the "Promised Land" on the other side of COVID – or even what that Promised Land will look like. It won't look like the world we left behind, but we do know one thing: God will be there with us. May we, as individuals and as a church, keep our eyes locked on our Lord to guide us in this year ahead, and may his presence give us hope.
