The Jewels of Scripture Revealed

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Chapter One The Book of Genesis

In the book of Genesis, in the first two chapters, the author writes of the creation of the universe, the creation of the world, the creation of animals and finally, the creation of human kind (Gen: 1,2). Most of us have heard these stories throughout our lives. Scientists have been debating the creation theory with evolution theory for a very long time.

To protect Mary from stoning, which by Jewish law is what happens to those caught in adultery, Joseph decides to quietly divorce Mary so as to not expose her to shame. Now watch closely, here comes the hidden in plain sight jewel. Have you seen the hidden in plain sight jewel yet? It's how God has spoken to Joseph. In chapter 12 of Saint Matthew's Gospel Jesus says, "...for although you have hidden these things from the learned you have revealed them to the childlike." Now we have to be very careful when you read this. Jesus did not say we must be like a child or childish, we must be child like, that is, we must be dependent on God just as Jesus was dependent on his father. Now the hidden jewel here, if you haven't already found it, is the dependency that all humans must have in God just like that of children and their dependency on their parents.
