Aiden's Column

Where's the what now?

Donald Rumsfeld once said that *There are known knowns; there are things we know we know. We also know there are known unknowns; that is to say we know there are some things we do not know. But there are also unknown unknowns—the ones we don't know we don't know.*

I was reminded of that quote this week when, during a catchup, one of our Wardens mentioned that I had a pigeon hole in the office. Now, having an allocated pigeon hole is perfectly normal... and yet it surprised me.

There are so many things to get to grips with as a new Rector: preaching series (and preachers), visiting bible studies, forward planning; Diocesan commitments, organising my office, not to mention multiple significant pastoral concerns... and that's all before thinking about preaching on the weekend.

So the thought that I might have a pigeon hole, and that it's something I ought to go looking for, simply hadn't occurred to me. It was an *unknown-unknown*. Similarly, it was only halfway through my first sermon at the Milton site that I looked to my left and realised that there was a pulpit I probably should have been preaching from... before afterwards learning that no, we *don't* use that piece of furniture, due to bugs in the sound system. Again: *unknown-unknowns*. People sometimes talk about the changes that come with a new Rector; but I've begun to think that some of these may be pure accidents: we just don't know how much we don't know.

All of that has got me thinking about evangelism. Next week, we'll welcome a team from the Christian group at the University of Canberra. They'll go into the streets of our parish, hoping to introduce locals to Jesus. On Thursday night, we'll join them at our church sites to think about sharing our stories of faith.

In all of that, it's worth remembering how little the people we're trying to reach might know about Christianity. Sociologists talk about "high context" cultures and church really can be a 'high context' culture: especially when so many no longer share our basic biblical knowledge.

This means we need to be culturally intelligent. Michael Jensen often talks about 'exegeting culture': understanding what culture is saying to us, and how it makes meaning. We do this so we can speak the Gospel into culture.

Paul wrote in 1 Cor. 9, To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. ... To Gentiles I became like a Gentile, to win the Gentiles. To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some.

Why not take time to understand the cultures around us? With patience and thought, it'll help us to reach people the way Paul did. And with a lot of patience, I might even locate my pigeon hole!

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

(Sermon Text for 8.30 & 11am)

¹³ Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope. ¹⁴ For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. ¹⁵ According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. ¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷ After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸ Therefore encourage one another with these words.

1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

(Sermon Text for 10.30am & 5.30pm)

Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, ² for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³ While people are saying, "Peace and safety," destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. ⁴ But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. ⁵ You are all children of the light and children of the day. We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. ⁶ So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be awake and sober. ⁷ For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. ⁸ But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet. ⁹ For God did not appoint us to suffer wrath but to receive salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁰ He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with him. ¹¹ Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.
