Tyabb Township Plan/Airfield

As some of you are painfully aware over recent weeks, particularly at night, for those who are light sleepers the noise has been a big issue. Bearing in mind in certain weather conditions, the amphitheater effect due to the location of the airfield, then combined with the extreme noise that the VicPol helicopter generates, the total result can be very annoying and disruptive. The Ratepayers Group and some individuals have been in contact with Police Air Wing to ascertain if the increase of flying activity at Tyabb has been brought on by the

It was confirmed that the helicopter was transiting on police activities, however some activities were in fact training. We have been assured that training was unintentional and that such future activity, hopefully, won't take place here. I'm positive nobody has any objection to emergency use by the Police helicopter, in fact the greater Police presence is great news; the same goes for any flying by the Air Ambulance. It's all a matter of good airmanship.

It should be pointed out that many years ago the Shire looked into some dedicated helipads for emergency and private use at strategic locations around the Shire. The question has to be asked: what happened to the study and outcome? Like a lot of things it appears it was too difficult and may have upset some people and just got lost in bureaucracy and never happened. We recently made representation to the Shire of a more than suitable location near Bluescope/ESSO, which is fully secured and being in a heavy industrial area, the noise would not be an issue. Obviously the bureaucrats know better.

Airshow

Just a heads up that the airshow will be held on Sunday, 11th March and we understand that like the last there will be some use of pyrotechnics during some displays. We, and the Shire, had many calls from concerned residents concerning the effect these pyrotechnics had on family pets and other livestock, so may we just remind everyone to be ready.

It was pleasure to see the large turnout at the Carols in the Park just before Christmas - more on this later in the newsletter.

Beware the increase in traffic around and through town now that all the schools have started the year. This also means that at certain times of the day there will be extra foot and bicycle movements on footpaths and crossing the road whilst on the way to and from school.

Hopefully the greater Police presence around the area will track down and apprehend those hoons that feel it necessary to leave their tyre details on the roads, the motorbike riders and 4WD drivers along the railway reserve and the graffiti artists who have recently left their mark on a variety of locations such as bus shelters, front fences, the track to Hastings and a large sign at the petrol station.

My How We've Grown



Since our early settlement in the 1840s, Tyabb has grown from a farming community into a predominantly residential one.

The 2016 Census results show just how much Tyabb has grown in recent years.

Since 1961 the number of homes has grown by nearly two-thirds and there are now around 3,500 of us calling Tyabb home.

Hey True Blue



Most of us are Australian born (82%) and Australian citizens (90%) with over half claiming ancestry from the British Isles (England, Scotland, Wales & Ireland) and just under half from Australia.

Overall 97% of us come from countries where English is spoken. The other main languages spoken in Tyabb are German, Greek & Dutch.

The Rise of the Non-believers



One of the most notable changes in Australia in recent years has been the decline in religious observance and affiliation and Tyabb is no exception.

In 2016 only half of us claimed any religious affiliation, with the various forms of Christianity being the overwhelming majority. The number of Tyabb residents with no religion has doubled in the last 20 years to nearly 1,400.

School Town



The majority of us are 35 - 59 and the second largest group are the empty nesters and retirees over 60.

Surprisingly, only 568 school age children live in Tyabb which contrasts with the 2,000+ who attend any of our schools and childcare centres each day; which is a clear statement of Tyabb's importance as an education centre for the wider Peninsula and a reminder to the Shire Council to fix up the traffic problems created at drop off & pick up times.

Smarter



Around 1,600 of us has a post-school qualification of some sort, with engineering (342), management & commerce (224) and education (224) being the most common. For most of us that is a Certificate I - IV or a Diploma, only 14% of Tyabb's residents over 15 years of age has a Bachelor's Degree or higher.

Work



Overall most of us over 15 are either in the workforce or studying, with only 772 doing neither. These are mainly retirees and pensioners. Unemployment is generally low at 4%, but for 15 - 24 year olds living in central Tyabb it is a worrying 23%.

It is a delight to see our little community growing and thriving, especially in the education sector.
