While I appreciated the focus on diversity, this book often felt long and drawn out. It tried to include as much background and semi-relevant information as possible and as a result felt more like an information dump than instruction for working with parents. It also presented a very idealized picture of what parent involvement should look like and only occasionally acknowledged that this image is not necessarily feasible for busy, working parents--the very kind it most stresses to reach out to.

Also, as a more personal note, as someone interested primarily in working at the secondary level, it was frustrating to occasionally see mentions of what was lacking at the secondary level without much actual instruction or direct information regarding middle school or high school students.
