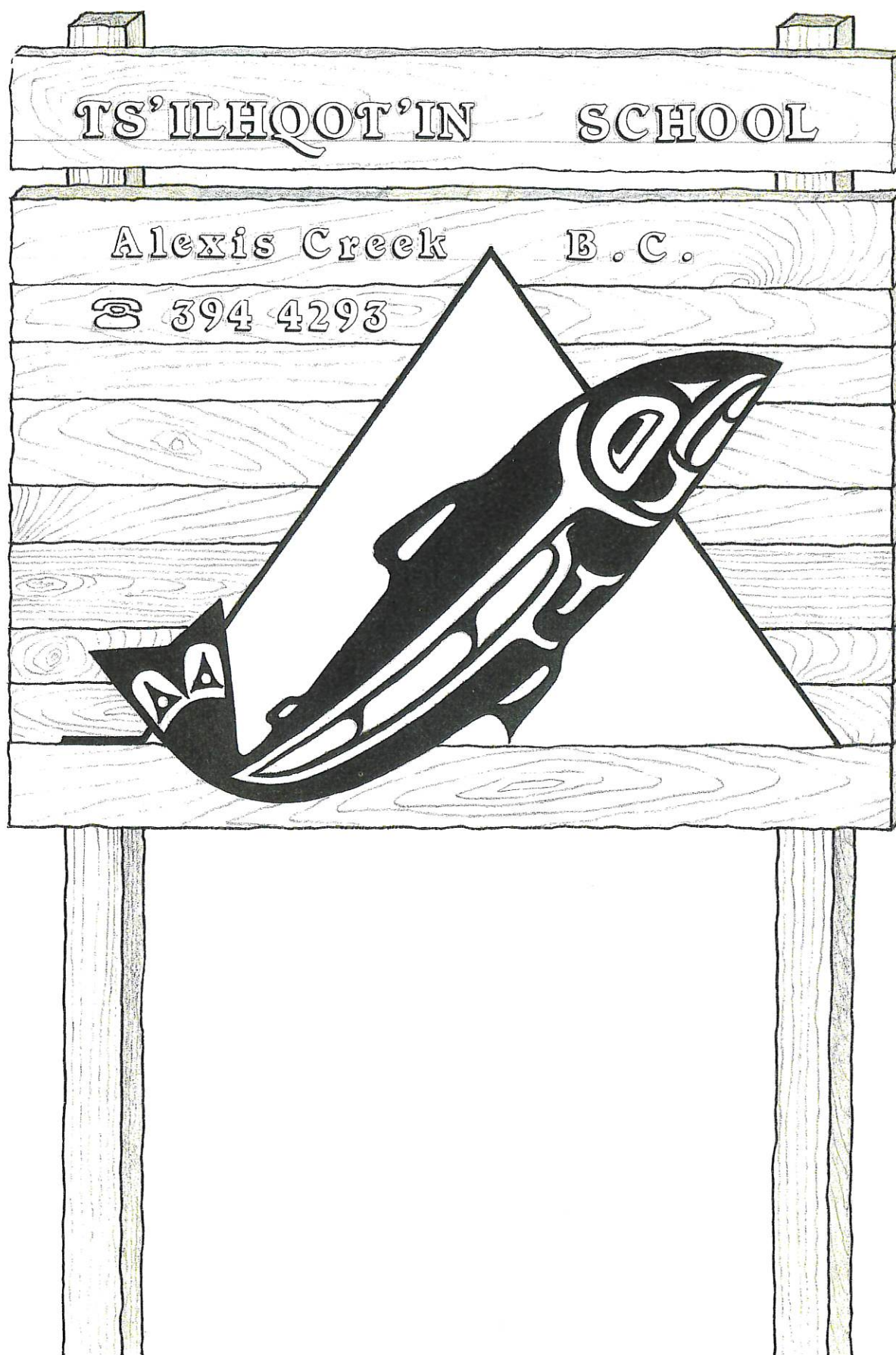


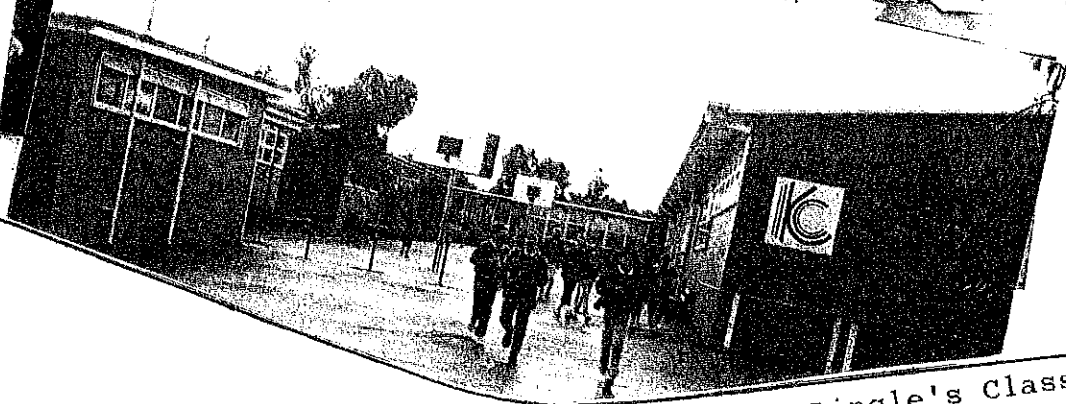
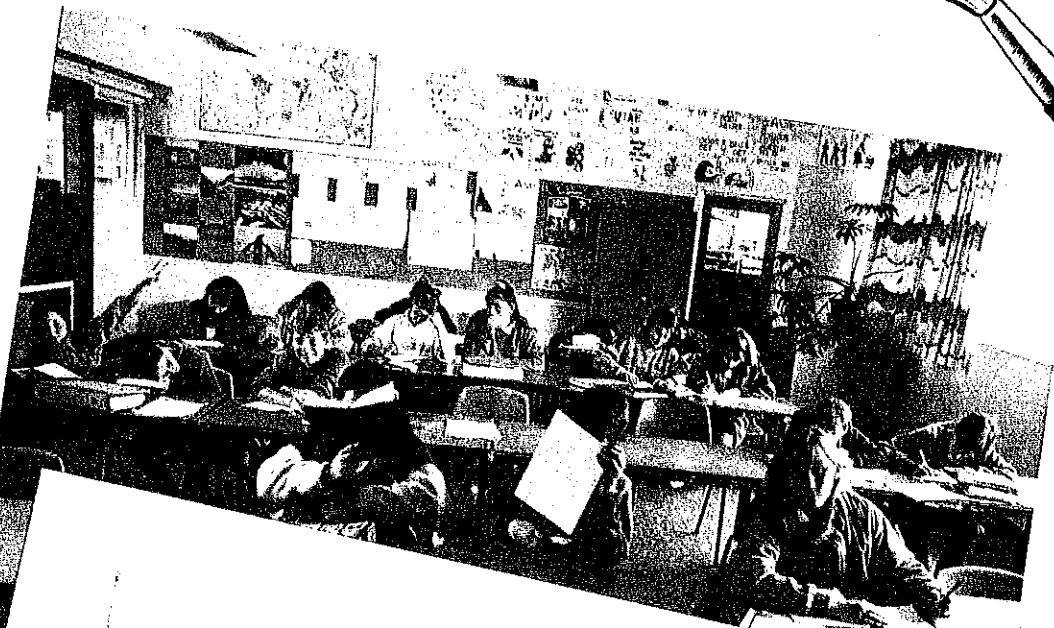

(Quotable Quotes)

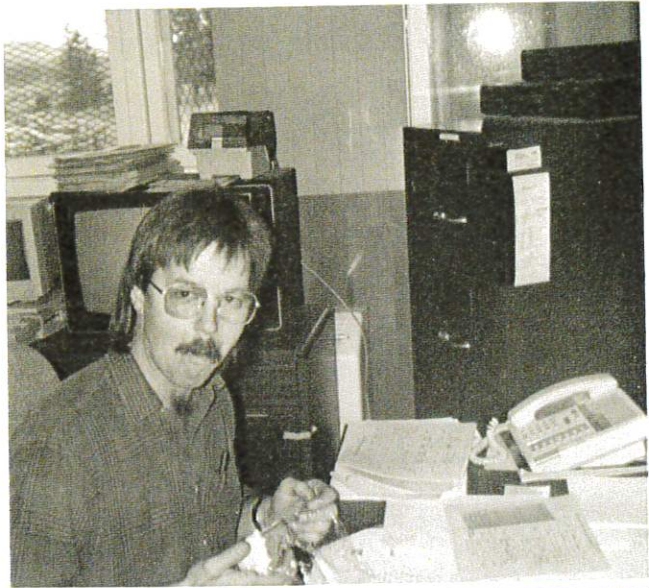

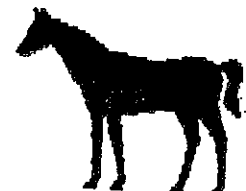
Save Our World
