



- Minutes from December 7, 2021 Meeting
- Chair Commissioner Chamberlain Called the Meeting to Order at 6:45 pm.
- Chair Commissioner Chamberlain requested attendees to Pledge of Allegiance.
- Roll Call Attendance
 - Chair Commissioner Chamberlain called for Roll Call Attendance of Commissioners. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain, Vice Chair Commissioner Moynihan, Secretary Commissioner Tyree, Treasurer Commissioner Holmes, Zoning Chair Commissioner Marshall, Commission Johnson were present. Commissioner Dodley was excused.
- Approval of November 9, 2021 Meeting Minutes
 - Chair Commissioner Chamberlain asked Commissioners to review the November 9, 2021 Minutes which resulted in no modifications. Commission Moynihan made a motion, which was seconded, to approve November 9, 2021 Meeting Minutes. Roll Call Voting resulted in unanimous approval.
- Preservation Funding
 - Walnut Grove Apartments. Mandy Mead and Joe Bernard, emphasized desire to establish relationship between the Commission and POAH (Preservation of Affordable Housing). No Commission action was necessary.
- Zoning
 - Z21-154 - 3306 Hairst Drive. Project representative was not present. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain will contact and reschedule.
- Council Residential Districting Commission Maps
 - Commissioners viewed Residential District Maps, had discussions and selected District Map C for submission. Treasurer Commission Holmes made a motion, which was seconded, to approve Residential District Map C. Roll Call Voting resulted in unanimous approval.
- Chair Update - Commissioner Chamberlain had no update.
- Zoning Update – Commissioner Marshall had no update.
- Budget Update – Treasurer Commissioner Holmes
 - Completed Expenditure Report and gave to Lynne LaCour, Neighborhood Pride Center Manager, to submit to Department of Neighborhoods.

- Community Update - Lynne LaCour, Neighborhood Pride Center Manager and Neighborhood Program Specialist.
 - Briefed on Mayor Ginther's Investments in Neighborhood Safety.
 - Informed The Ohio State University Office of Diversity and Inclusion accepting applications for Young Scholars Program.
 - Made available by Attorney General's Office open registration for Virtual Third Annual Human Trafficking Summit.
 - Requested assistance from The Ohio State University, John Glenn Institute, for Commission to suggest small developer zoning applicants for interviews.
 - Sought feedback from Columbus City School students, staff, families and community members on final phase of Transform.
 - Voiced traffic speeding complaints by Greenbrier community.
 - Rolled out City of Columbus' Vision Zero Columbus Action Plan. The Action Plan identified High Injury Network of city streets that have a higher density of fatal or serious crashes involving vulnerable road users; pedestrians, bicyclists and motorcyclists are inherently more at risk if involved in crashes. Streets on the network may run through other municipalities.

- New Business
 - Secretary Commission Tyree brief on City Council Recognition Commissions for services.
 - Participated in City Council Eastside Meeting, Breakout Room 4: Councilmember Mitchell Brown, Public Safety, Veterans and Senior Affairs. Emphasize Far East Area Commission had constantly noted a Capital Budget need item of a Far East Police Substation. At one point, Grant Ames, Legislative Assistant, asked "Where would you like it (Police Substation) to be located." Commissioner Tyree informed the location would be a Commission discussion. Commissioner Tyree further suggested a better consideration would be to have a Recreation Center included with the Far East Police Substation. Commissioners agreed to discuss location for Far East Police Substation with Recreation Center at the next meeting.

- Adjournment
 - Secretary Commissioner Tyree made a motion, which was seconded, to adjourn. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain called for Raised Hands Voting for approval which resulted in unanimous approval. The meeting ended at 8:18 pm.
