Three officers of the 32nd Battalion. Left to right: Lieutenant ?; Colonel Coghill; Major Hughes. These two officers as named trained the volunteers of 32nd Battalion, camped at Cheltenham Racecourse and their first major action was at the now famous battle of Fronmelles in July 1916, where they suffered great casualties. Some men from Coghill's original squad are among those recently identified from mass graves, such as Private Walter Hainsworth Pretty of Kilkenny. Coghill was the first Headmaster of Woodville High School and also taught at Adelaide and Unley High
