Spring Valley Update for March/April Newsleaf – 2022

Spring Valley's grounds and facilities remain open for winter hours through March and will transition to spring/summer hours on April 1. In accordance with state of Illinois health guidelines, the Park District requires all visitors to wear a mask when inside our facilities regardless of their vaccination status. District 54 schools are continuing their return to Spring Valley for field trip programs, with all 2nd graders and Kindergarteners visiting during the next few months. Meanwhile, we continue to offer a full schedule of family, youth, and adult programs. Several popular special events will more closely resemble their pre-pandemic look and feel in 2022.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails are open for walkers every day from 8am-5pm through March. Starting April 1, hours will extend to sunset to accommodate our longer days.
- The gate leading onto Heritage Farm's walking paths from St. Matthew's Church will remain closed through March but will reopen daily on April 1.
- The **Nature Center Museum** is open to visitors Wednesday-Sunday from 10am-4pm. On April 1, these hours will be extended, with the facility open daily from 10am-6pm. The restrooms, drinking fountain and vending will be opened every day for visitor use.
- Volkening Heritage Farm's Visitor Center and other farm buildings will remain closed through the end of March but will then reopen Wednesday-Sunday from 10am-4pm starting April 1.
- **Bison's Bluff Nature Playground** will remain open daily from 10am-4:00pm throughout the winter, except during snowy, icy or rainy weather. Admission is free during winter. This will also change on April 1. The nature playground will then be open daily from 10am-7pm, weather permitting, and the admission fees for children ages 2-12 will once again be in place.
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, trail maintenance, and with some of our events and programs. If you are willing and able to assist with projects, please contact Brenda Korecky at brkorecky@parkfun.com.

NEW - Spring Valley App

There's now an app for Spring Valley visitors! Staff has recently developed an app for use on either Android or Apple smartphones. It features not only information on hours, site features, and facilities, but two guided tours that provide information on various natural history or historical topics as you walk the trails. The app is FREE and available from either the Google Play Store or Apple Store (simply type Spring Valley Nature Center into the search bar). It is also available as a web-app by going to www.springvalley.stqry.app.

Spring Events & Programs

Spring Valley is very excited to be offering some of our popular special events once again this year! Most of the events continue to provide mostly outdoor activities and unique experiences for all ages. Pre-registration is recommended for some of these events, although some are walk-in admission only. Nearly all classes have limited capacity and require pre-registration. and will be held outdoors whenever possible. More information and on-line registration are available via the Park District's virtual **Spring Program Guide**, found at www.parkfun.com.

Sugar Bush Fair's popular pancake breakfast and outdoor maple syruping demonstrations will return on Saturday & Sunday, March 19 & 20, 9am-noon! Breakfast reservations will be limited to 500 each day and can be made by visiting www.parkfun.com. Breakfast reservations are \$6/plate if purchased prior to 4:00pm on March 18. Day-of tickets, if available, will be \$8/plate.

Sunset Fire & Picnic on the Prairie will also return on Saturday, April 9, 5-7pm. Reservations are recommended for this popular evening program exploring the benefits of fire for our Midwestern natural areas. The registration cost is \$3/resident or \$4/non-resident, with children 3 and under free. Reservations are available at www.parkfun.com.

Earth Day Party is back, scheduled for Sunday, April 24, 12-4pm. A variety of green living and environmental awareness activities and demonstrations will be available in both the Nature Center's backyard and at Heritage Farm, including a display of live hawks and owls, and some with take home crafts or plantings. A wagon shuttle will transport visitors between Heritage Farm and the Nature Center. Parking will be available at either the Nature Center or St. Matthew's Church. Admission is paid at the event and is \$3/person or \$12/family.

Eggsapalooza, which takes place Saturday, April 16, combines a scavenger hunt on the trails with an egg hunt near Merkle Cabin, followed by a wagon ride. This popular family program usually sells out, so pre-register early for one of six sessions, starting at 9:00am and repeating every half-hour. Registration fee is \$5/resident or \$6/non-resident.

Walpurgis Night returns to Heritage Farm on Saturday, April 30. This traditional German holiday features witches in April, marshmallows around a campfire, and a wagon ride. Pre-register for one of four sessions starting at 6:00pm and repeating every half hour. Registration fee is \$5/resident or \$6/non-resident.

Lil' Farmers, Wednesdays during April and May, 9:00-10:15am. Parents or grandparents can spend a morning with their 3–5-year-old, exploring the farm and meeting the animals. Each week will feature a new interaction and new adventures. Pre-registration is required, with the fee \$10/resident child or \$12/non-resident child (caregiver attends with the child at no extra charge).

Full Moon Hike & Campfire – Saturday, April 16, 7:00-9:00pm Bundle up the kids and join in an early spring full-moon hike, finishing up with a snack around the campfire. Reservations required; fee is \$6/resident or \$8/non-resident child.

Ellsworth founded the Spring Valley Nature Club in 1974 as a not-for-profit service organization which provides volunteer and financial support for Spring Valley and promotes conservation, nature, and environmental education. The Club sponsors nature programs and teacher field trips, and members volunteer at festivals and fund raisers. We have been working hard since 1974. Won't you join us?
