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**1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>:** In first and second grade we will begin with our academic work this week. Last week was spent getting to know each other. Both classes will begin working hard on handwriting and phonics this week. We will also be doing a pretest on sight words through the week, so I can see where everyone is. Both classes will also begin Saxon math this week. Second grade will have their first spelling test on Friday. ME folders turned out amazing! Thank you all for your hard work on them. I will get them posted for all to see. 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**3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup>:** Our class had a great first two days. We went over procedures and class rules as well as expectations. Most students have already started reading for their AR for first quarter. Students will need to have their goal met by Oct. 8th. If they don't have the goal completed, they will be staying in from recess until it is finished. This week we will have several tests. Both classes will have a spelling test on Friday along with a Social Studies test. Third grade will have an English test over simple sentences on Friday as well. This week I will be setting up my Remind for my classroom. Watch for it and make sure you get added, so we can communicate throughout the week. Here's to a great week! **-Mrs. Cooper**

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**5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup>:** Welcome back everyone! This week students will start in their textbooks and will practice getting used to their new schedule. Spelling tests will be on Thursdays and we will also do a Word of the Day and a Problem of the Day in our classroom. In Science, 5th graders will start a unit on "Classification" and 6th graders will begin reading about "The Rock Cycle". In English, we will start reviewing types of sentences and subject and predicate. In Reading, students will look at main idea and supporting details. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be in "Our Nation" studies weekly magazine and 6th grade will start "World History" studies weekly.

**5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> AR Requirements:** Both grades need to pass 3 AR books by Oct. 15th. 5th graders have a 100-page minimum for each book and 6th grade has a 120-page minimum. Please, let me know if you have any questions. I look forward to a great year! **-Mrs. Foster**

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**7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup>:** It's wonderful to be back for another school year. I'm very encouraged by the first couple of days and hope we can keep on rolling and being productive.

**5<sup>th</sup>/Sixth Math:** Fifth grade is looking at the nature of counting numbers and sequences and the reading and writing of larger whole numbers. Sixth grade is working on missing number equations and an early taste of the order of operations.

**7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup>:** In science, seventh grade will start out by reviewing some concepts related to matter, including subatomic components and chemical and physical properties. Eighth grade will begin a unit on the nature of electricity and



magnetism. In grammar, we will start the year by reviewing types of sentences and grammar and usage.
