## Nov 11th Brinky Town's 130th Birthday

Brinkworth's History Group and Progress Association members and friends celebrated the 130th anniversary of the town's foundation at Stockyard Reserve, in perfect weather.

After Graham Bales welcomed everyone and gave a brief account of how the town came to be, Fred Groom introduced the main theme for the day, the history of Brinkworth District Town Band, before handing over to Helen Weckert who first described how she had ridden to Adelaide by train when the railway was still in operation and what a relaxed way it was to travel there and back. She went on to illustrate her talk with copies of historic photos of the band from the Brinkworth museum collection.

Fred's wife Barbara and daughter Deborah then took over the proceedings.

Barbara read a fascinating account from The Brinkworth Literary Society Magazine, c.1930 of the band's adventures, travelling to various towns to take part in competitions, on unmade roads and often not getting home until the early

hours of the morning. Apparently it was a lot of fun. Barbara then entered quiz mistress mode and, with Deborah's help, posed a series of questions with the audience required to raise their hands with the answers, to be rewarded with a Fantale lolly if correct.

Deborah, who is taking a break from many years playing with the Hahndorf band, had some amusing anecdotes of her own before accompanying the singing of Happy Birthday to Brinkworth while Bob Green cut a magnificent cake made by Janet Bales.

G'day everyone,

I hope I am not the only one who is wondering where the month of November has gone? I feel it was only yesterday, that I was signing a document dated the 8th November!! Only one month until Christmas day, WOWEE!!!

**The last two days I have got to spend extended time over in Occasional Care with our youngest learners,** and it really struck me as I was reflecting how fortunate we are as educators to be able to play a role in the lives of these young learners. We are able to play a small part in their formative years of their play and learning, and guide them in their social and emotional growth. To see this in action and observe that growth is amazing. The preschool area has been nurtured and grown by many outstanding educators over the years into the welcoming and warm space that it is today. To have Preschool and Occasional Care utilising this space fully again next year is fantastic. We are all looking forward to providing growth and learning opportunities moving forward for your young learners.

**As a staff, we reflect on our practice often, and look for ways to improve learning and development.** Last year we identified that coming in after lunch our learners were sometimes still ready for activity and not learning. We implemented 10 minutes of quiet reading to help with self regulation. Previously in this section I have highlighted this change, and the effect it has had on developing a love of reading in our learners. As the end of year leans toward reflection, I was absolutely gobsmacked this week listening to our Year 1 learners this week, sounding out and confidently pronouncing 10 and 11 letter words, and being able to talk about their meaning. To be able to see this growth is testament to the work from the learners, parents, educators and everyone else involved with the learners. We are seeing this growth across all of our learners and again, we are all very excited to see this continuing into the future.

**The pool works** are getting to the almost finished stage! It is really beginning to look like a brand new pool!!! With this project nearing completion, it continues to fill me with a sense of pride and achievement in our BPECC community.

**When the need was identified we needed to fundraise our Governing Council stepped up, Brinkworth Community groups chipped in and we have achieved a wonderful outcome.**

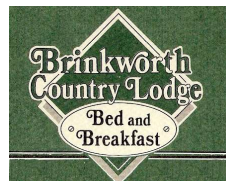

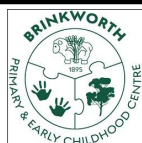
