IN 2009, SHORTLY AFTER FRIENDS OF HISTORIC RIVER-VIEW CEMETERY TOOK OWNERSHIP OF THE CEMETERY, WE BEGAN A PROJECT TO IDENTIFY ALL VETERANS WHO ARE BURIED AT RIVERVIEW CEMETERY. We began with a list of approximately 600 veterans provided to us by VFW Post 2907. We have expanded that list to 1153 veterans who have served our country. Each veteran is listed on our website.

ship with John W. Pauley Memorials of Wilmington, we

undertook an effort to order and install government-provided gravestones for those veterans whose graves were unmarked. We began with those who were veterans of the Civil War. Our first order was for 11 Civil War style markers, which were received and installed. When we submitted our second order, the

government changed the rules and cemeteries were no longer authorized to request veteran gravestones so that order was cancelled by the government. There was some pushback by veteran organizations, and at least one congressional hearing was held regarding this issue.

In late 2017, the rules were changed and cemeteries were again permitted to order gravestones for veterans buried on the grounds. We re-instituted our project, and in June of this year (2019) we ordered 19 grave markers for Civil War veterans. All of those grave markers have been received and installed.

There are many steps to this process beyond filling out and submitting VA Form 40-1330 (Claim for Standard Government Headstone or Marker). We must do the necessary

research to confirm and document the veteran's military service. For Civil War veterans, we begin by searching for an obituary through available on-line resources. We also visit the Delaware Public Archives to peruse their card file of the Delaware Civil War veterans. We search available on-line Civil War databases and other online resources. Ultimately, we must obtain a copy of the individual veterans' Muster-In and Muster-Out paperwork and submit it with the request to the government. It is also necessary to submit a copy of the cemetery's Burial Register to confirm that the named veteran is buried at Riverview. Once paperwork has been submitted, it can take a long as 8 weeks for actual gravestones to arrive. All markers have been installed.


We plan to order new gravestones for the remaining 40-50 Civil War veterans interred at Riverview whose graves are unmarked, once we have confirmed and documented their military service (as described above). We also plan to order replacement gravestones for 6 other Civil War veterans whose graves are currently marked with a government- provided grave marker, but the marker is no longer readable.
