UBC Aid for Ukraine



Thank you for your efforts to support the Baptist General Association of Virginia's efforts to support Ukranian Baptists to assist with humanitarian needs. Our members donated a total of \$485.00

through UBC to the **BGAV** Ukraine Fund, channeled to Ukraine through the European Baptist Federation (EBF), of which Ukrainian Baptists are members; the moneys helped purchase food, hygiene items, medicine, blankets, and needed items for the internally displaced people (IDPs). https://donatenow.networkforgood.org/bgav. Be sure to specify Ukraine Aid on the drop-down menu. As the Missions Committee considers other ways we can help, our Missions partner, **Baptist World Alliance**, is very involved through **Baptist World Aid**, collaborating with

Cooperative Baptist Fellowship to work through NGO's and other denominations both on the ground in Ukraine and in Eastern Europe. Most churches in areas of heavy fighting have been destroyed, so the leaders share these prayer points: pray for a just peace; for separated families; and for strength, endurance, wisdom, and courage. COVID-19 CHURCH UPDATE

As reported in April, the CLCEB voted to change our building guidelines to "Masks Optional" effective April 1st.



That decision was based on current Fairfax County COVID-19 level of "low" posted on CDC community level map. Please note that cases are on the rise in Northern Virginia and the District of Columbia with Alexandria, Arlington, and DC status changed from low to medium on the CDC community level map. Since Fairfax County COVID-19 level posted on this map remains **low**, we will continue to make use of **masks optional** on our UBC campus. Our Parish Nurse monitors posted ratings and will notify quickly if change is needed. We ask and post on the doors that if you are sick do not come into the building.

Rev. Moyer and Mrs. Caffrey will continue their current practice of reviewing building user requests. Please continue using hand sanitizer, 20-second handwashing, and good health hygiene (elbow bumps and covering coughs or sneezes to prevent spread of colds and flu). Extra cleaning is being done; we continue to disinfect and take attendance for extra caution. Our Parish Nurse or Staff can answer any questions or individual concerns. We will remain flexible, vigilant, and responsive to public health requirements. Thank you for your cooperation!

Happy Mother's Day! to moms, grandmothers, greatgrandmothers, aunts, step-moms, women who long to be mothers, women who lost a child, might be facing infertility, have strained relationships with their mothers, caregivers, and all women who are nurturers and share their love with others. We will honor you this Sunday!

May Health Focus

The warm weather is here, and we are all anxious to get back outside!!! Here are some tips for a fun, safe summer:




- Stay out of the direct sun. Seek shaded or airconditioned areas such as libraries or malls.
- Drink plenty of fluids. (Avoid alcohol and caffeine.)
- Wear light-colored, light-weight clothing. Use hats with brims and sunscreen for more protection.
- Anyone showing signs of heat stroke (altered mental state, not sweating, nausea) should seek medical attention immediately.
- Apply sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher and both UVA and UVB protection before you go outside, even on cloudy days.
- Ticks are most active in late June and early July. Prevent Lyme Disease and other tick-borne illnesses by avoiding ticks and tick bites.
- Mosquitoes are most active in the summer months. Protect yourself against West Nile Virus and other mosquito-borne illnesses by using bug spray with DEET, avoiding mosquito breeding grounds, and taking other preventive measures. Enjoy your time outside!!!!
