A BETTER WAY:



TO REMOVE THREAD FROM YOUR MACHINE

Have you ever been in a hurry to change thread on your machine and lifted the spool and tugged? We'll confess we're quilty of doing this on occasion, but there's a better way that's kinder to your machine. Pulling the thread backwards like that can cause *tension problems*. Especially with computerized machines. That's not to mention all the *extra lint* that can be released from thread running backwards through machine parts.

A BETTER WAY: is to snip the thread near the spool and pull the remaining threaded piece out through the needle.

close at 4 PM Entry fee is \$7.00 and under 6 Free.


