Pentecost Sunday (A)

Important message from Fr. Peter to parishioners of St. Claude and St. Denis

Dear parishioners of St. Claude and St. Denis,

As of Friday, May 22, 2020, Manitoba's Chief Health Public Officer, Dr. Brent Roussin, has increased the limit on the size of indoor public gatherings to 25 people and 50 people for outdoor gatherings.

Yesterday, May 29, 2020, I received the new directives from Archbishop LeGatt concerning the opening of churches and chapels as well as all safety measures to follow during the time of Covid-19. This guideline, the Liturgical Protocol No. IV will be shared with you along with our parish bulletin.

After discussing with some members of Parish Pastoral Council, we decided to celebrate the Mass outdoors in our two parishes this weekend, Pentecost Sunday, May 31, 2020. In St. Denis: at 9:00 Am: Outdoor Bilingual Mass in front of the church.

In St. Claude: at 11:00 Am: Outdoor Bilingual Mass under the trees at Eastside of the church.

Please spread the news!

Some important notes:

- At this moment, we are allowed to have 49 parishioners + priest for outdoor Masses.
- If you do not feel healthy or you do not feel comfortable, please stay home.
- When attending the Mass, please bring a lawn chair with you. The parish will prepare chairs for those who do not lawn chairs. You also can stay in your car, lower the windows to attend the Mass.
- I had prepared facemasks for you. For the common good of all, I ask you to sanitize hands, wear a mask and practice social distancing (2 meters or 6 feet apart) when attending the Mass.

Why outdoor Mass?

- Open space, fresh air, easier to keep social distancing.
- More people to attend the Mass (50 vs 25 indoor Mass)
- For indoor Mass, we must clean the church after each celebration.
- We are learning to adapt to this "new normal" together, so I am open to welcome all constructive ideas. This is just a trial. The pastoral council and I need more time to figure out how to best prepare for indoor Mass in the months ahead.

I am excited to see you again this weekend. May the Lord keep you safe and healthy.

Time flies. I will be celebrating my first-year anniversary as a priest on Monday June 1. I would like to take this chance first to give thanks to the Lord and to express my deep gratitude to all of you for your support since I have come to serve you as a humble pastor. Renew the face of the earth

Living in a fraternal community, we recognize each person's originality: his or her unique gifts. There are always people among us who are more inspirational than others and who will share their wisdom. Others share their scientific knowledge, and many are excellent teachers. When we are in contact

with them, we appreciate dialogue and respect. "To each one, writes St. Paul, is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." TOGETHER WE RENEW THE FACE OF EARTH.

Jesus said: "Peace be with you ! As the Father has sent me, so I send you." The Apostles were "filled with the Holy Spirit." They felt the overwhelming experience of God's love as a great wave of tenderness. This is what St. Paul asserts when he says that "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.(Rom 5:5). TOGETHER WE RENEW THE FACE OF THE EARTH.

We learn about the phenomenon of languages. This manifestation of the Spirit was the sign that something new had happened in the world. It is surprising that speaking in "other languages" did not create confusion instead, amazingly, brought about understanding and unity. Unity in diversity is possible. In this way, Scripture emphasized the contrast between the Tower of Babel and Pentecost. *TOGETHER WE RENEW THE FACE OF THE EARTH.*

At Pentecost, all spoke different languages and yet everyone understood each other. At Babel, these people were driven by a desire for power and their own glory. At Pentecost, the Apostles proclaimed God's great works. They were not thinking about working to augment their fame but to give glory to God. As a result, everyone was able to understand what was said in his/her own language. God had returned to the center of their lives. *TOGETHER WE RENEW THE FACE OF THE EARTH.*

The more communication develops, the more we can experience God's tenderness and love. Why does God communicate with us? Only for love, because *good* by its nature is "communicative"! Let's forget the tower of Babel dictated by selfishness and be touched by Pentecost dictated by love and respect for another's freedom. *TOGETHER WE RENEW THE FACE OF THE EARTH.*
