

DISTRICT SPOTLIGHT Cumberland/Perry

The Cumberland/Perry District has been challenged during this pandemic, but I am very pleased that our parish Councils have been active using phone calls, Zoom meetings, masks and social distancing.

<u>Our Lady of Lourdes Council</u> had two soup and sub sales, and collected 30 Boxes of Joy and Sweats for Vets. Clothing was donated to the Lebanon VA Hospital. Baked items were sent to Bethesda Mission and held a cookie sale. The Ronny Powley Food Bank and Catholic Charities received donations from the Giving tree.

<u>St. Bernadette Council</u> held Zoom meetings, collected Sweats for Vets, donated to the Perry County Veterans, collected baby items, and collected donations for Morningstar Pregnancy Services. They plan to make Easter Eggs to sell at the local market.

<u>Our Lady of Good Counsel Council</u> had a soup sale, a baked ziti sale, and collected Boxes of Joy. They are currently updating their by-laws and participating in the Spiritual Adoption of the unborn.

<u>St Theresa Council</u> had a Food Truck sale, and Soup Sale. For Baptisms, a card and a Prayer square is sent and a Baby Blanket is given. The CCW is active in the Prayer Shawl Ministry.

<u>Good Shepherd Council</u> sold Mums during the Parish Food Truck sale and had an Apple Blessing. They are active in the Prayer Shawl Ministry and plan to do more later this year.

<u>St Katharine Drexel Council</u> had several outdoor Rosary meetings, a Take-Out Pasta Dinner, Bake Sale, and a Soup Sale. \$1,900 was sent to the Diocese for the Seminarians and \$660 was donated to the Silence of Mary Home for the homeless. Several virtual programs were held including Sister Geralyn Schmidt who presented a livestreamed Advent Evening of Reflection. At the present time, council is accepting donations for St. Michaels Indian School in Arizona founded by St. Katharine Drexel in 1902.

The History of

HDCCW SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The idea of a scholarship sponsored by HDCCW was introduced and discussed at the final meeting of Shaping the Future, an Ad Hoc Committee, in 2003. At the August 24, 2003 quarterly meeting, Carm Urich moved that HDCCW provide a Scholarship. Peg Clissa seconded the motion.

The scholarship was established to promote Council and its outreach, and to leave a lasting legacy of empowerment, support and education for the young women of the diocese.

President Betty Kress appointed a Committee. The chair, Joyce Scott, contacted the Diocese of Harrisburg and other organizations to become knowledgeable in scholarship awarding procedures. A vote was taken in 2004 to carry the committee forward. In October 2004 a committee meeting was held. Present were Joyce Scott-Chair, Betty Kress, Pat Leone, Terri Rosenstein, Marian Sneeringer and Carm Urich. The purpose was to develop guidelines for a scholarship to be presented to a High School Senior, who will be attending an accredited college, university, or trade school. It was decided that she must be residing in the Diocese of Harrisburg and be sponsored by her mother or grandmother/guardian who is a member of a parish CCW. The scholarship shall be awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement, leadership, character, community and church involvement. The first Scholarship was awarded in 2006 and since then 34 have been awarded.

Hispanic Apostolate

In 2019, generous donations to the Hispanic Apostolate Ministry from parish councils totaled \$1,645. These funds helped the Apostolate establish the first Diocesan Council for Hispanic Youth called *Pastoral Juvenil Council* (PJC).



The group's goal is to plan many youth-focused events designed to bring our youth together in faith, harmony, and love for one another. They hosted <u>Christmas Around</u> <u>the World</u> which was held on December 14, 2019. This event brought youth of different cultures together.







ASK THE PARLIAMENTARIANS

A LENTEN PRAYER

Here is a question that is frequently asked by new parish presidents.

I am the new president of my parish and now I need to hold a meeting. Can you help?

Sure. Ask your parliamentarian or any experienced member of your board to help you. Together you can compose the agenda for the upcoming meeting and then **write a script** from it- filling in the script with every word you plan to say for the entire meeting within each category on the agenda.

What do I need to include in the script? (remember this is for your eyes only)

<u>The script would include:</u> -The names of all the members you will be introducing to give reports and the content of the report.

-Introductions or comments you plan to make.

-The steps in processing motions (on a side sheet of paper) even your name- if you get nervous!

Phrases that you will find helpful:

- The meeting will come to order...
- Are there any corrections to the Minutes?
- Are there any questions concerning the Treasurer's Report?
- The Treasurer's report will be filed for audit...
- The next item of business...
- The Chair recognizes...
- Anything for the Good of the Council...
- If there is no objection, the meeting is adjourned.

We hope this has been helpful to new Presidents as well as a *good review* for all Presidents.
