1st/2nd: First and second grades are continuing their work on handwriting. First grade is working hard on our reading skills and starting basic math facts too. We will be discussing autumn this week as well. Second grade is working on comparisons and using complete sentences. We will also continue learning about our great United States. Please remember **second grade, it is important to be practicing those math facts.** I hope everyone has a great week!

Some upcoming tests to keep in mind are as follows: **3rd grade math test will be October 6th**, both grades will be taking a **4 Kinds of Sentences Quiz on October 7th**, and I am looking at both grades taking another Science test around October 13th or 14th. In Science, 5th graders will be starting a new chapter over stars and galaxies and 6th graders will begin a new chapter on properties of matter. In English, both grades will be reviewing singular and plural possessive nouns. In Reading, 5th and 6th graders will review a unit on inferences and will take a quiz on Friday. In Social Studies, both grades will continue working through our unit on the Presidential Election. 5th graders will have a states and capitals test on Friday over #1-30 and 6th grade will have an Africa Part 2 test for Geography on Friday. **7th/8th Comm. Arts:** Both grades have been reviewing "Theme" and have been reading a play about "The Diary of Anne Frank".
