MATRON'S MARCH 2013 REPORTING PART CHILDREN'S HEALTH

Though there was seasonal spraying in homes including at SOCH done by the Ministry of Health to combat mosquito. In February and March we experienced headaches, fevers, vomiting and stomach pains to our children as a result of malaria outbreak. To assist our children and avoid paying huge sums of money to a private clinic there is need for funds to purchase anti-malaria tablets, equipment that can be used to detect malaria parasites. If possible the group which is coming in July should come with sanitary materials for cleaning wounds and anti-fungi medicine for round worms. We are hoping for good results as we are now approaching the end of the rainy season.

UNIFORM

The idea of having two uniforms was great, the uniforms that have been sawn has really made a difference to Kambobe Primary School going children. But we still need to buy material to make or buy for other children going to Kamwala and Boma schools also.
