

## Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 21, 2021



## NOTES FROM FR. VANDEWALLE

Christ the King Sunday – The last Sunday of the Church Calendar, before we begin Advent, is Christ the King Sunday, where we recognize that Christ is the King of the Universe and all of History. The victory is ultimately His and so allow him to also be King of our lives.

Battlefield and Doorstep to the Kingdom - At the "Liturgy" (primarily the Mass, but also the other Sacraments), it is Jesus that is praying in us; He prays through the Word of God, the priest, the people, and through the sacred actions which He commanded to be done in memory of Him. Therefore the liturgy is a foretaste of heaven. What a great word is foretaste, "a little taste beforehand". I explained to the children at daily mass that the Church, being God's house, is like God's heavenly house in miniature OR like the doorstep to God's kingdom. I particularly like the metaphor of doorstep to the Kingdom. It means that Jesus is acting in us at mass as we pray toward heaven and toward the Father. It means that we are getting strength from the doorstep to then go out into the world and help bring the Kingdom to the world and the world to the doorstep of the Kingdom. It means that the world is the place of battle for the Kingdom and that heaven is the place of celebration after the final victory. It means that the doorstep - Mass in Church - is a privileged place of connection. The doorstep also becomes a place of healing of battle wounds, so we can return to the fray. The Gospel for this Christ the King Sunday presents Jesus before Pilate: Jesus explains "My kingdom is not of this world" or else Jesus' followers would be physically battling to save Him. Pilate himself is in an in-between place; with his limited knowledge, he is considering the truthfulness of Jesus' words. (If we find ourselves in a place of confusion, remember to call on Him who is the way, and TRUTH, and life). On this side of history, we know the meaning of Jesus' words and the irony of Pilate's words: "What is truth?" Jesus' Kingdom was inaugurated through Jesus' sacrificial, suffering action – He was not a passive king, but a king willing to do the primary work (of salvation) and at the same time to lead by example. Then he calls us to meritorious action as well. To be part of his kingdom-winning battalion means that we are called to suffer the hardships of the mission along with the King ("... unless you take up your cross, you cannot be my disciples ...") who is never absent from us. Meanwhile we are assured of the ultimate victory of the Kingdom. To keep getting healing and strength, keep coming to the
