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We gather around this Advent Wreath knowing that we are not perfect that we all are capable of doing evil. Jesus reveals to us that God loves us just as we are—and this love of God empowers us to bring peace, hope, love, and justice to each other, our society, and our world.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah:

A child is born to us, a son is given us, upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonderful, Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful.

All:

We light this candle to proclaim the coming of the light of God into the world. With the coming of this light there is peace, for Christ is called the "Prince of Peace," Christ's name is also Emmanuel, "God is with us."

Two candles of the Wreath are lighted.

All:

Eternal God, we thank you that through all the years you have given peace to your people. Help us to have peace in our lives.


We pray that in this Advent season, we may, by what we do, show your presence to the sick, to the hungry, and to the lonely, so that they too may have peace.

The First Reading

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction, O Jerusalem, and put on forever the beauty of the glory from God. At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or to lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.
