

• CHILDREN"S MESSAGE

Theme: God Is Awesome Scripture: Revelation 4:1-11

Items Needed: Pictures of God's Thrown, A Crown, Jewels

Good morning! I'm so happy you are with us today. Do you know why I'm so happy? No, I didn't win the lottery or miraculously have all my problems disappear... I'm happy because we get to come here and be in God's presence. Do you know how awesome God is? God is so awesome we're all included in God's family and God wants to share his love with all of us. That's why God invited you to come to Worship today. Did you know that you were personally invited by God to come and worship this morning? It's true! You might have been drug here by your parents or Grandparents, but it was really God who asked you to come in the first place...

One of the things that makes our Worship so special and important is that when we worship all the angels and other beings in heaven also stop whatever they're doing and worship too. In the Book of Revelation, that's the very last book in the Bible, a man named John was invited to witness this heavenly worship. Most of what is written in that book describes the things he saw when he had his vision, that's like a dream, of what goes on in heaven. Wouldn't you like to know what heaven is like?

John says he saw the throne of God! I don't think he actually saw God's face, but he described a super bright light and the throne was surrounded by a rainbow. Do you remember any other stories from the Bible that talk about rainbows? That's right, God made the rainbow after Noah and the flood as a sign that God would never again destroy people in that way. The rainbow is a sign of God's promise to love us no matter how badly we sin. Do you know what else God's thrown room looks like? John says it's very shiny, like very precious gems. Maybe like these in the picture...

I think John was one lucky man for getting to see inside the throne room of God. I hope I get to see it for myself someday. When we think about God we usually think about an old man, like a Father figure who takes us on his knee and gives the best hugs, but John saw a different kind of God. What he saw was so beautiful he could only use words for the most beautiful things he had ever seen to describe God. So, he wrote down that God looked like a rainbow and was made up of many beautiful jewels. Now that's an awesome God!

Let's pray... Awesome God, we love you because you first loved us. Help us to see you for the beautiful and loving God you truly are. Give us a glimpse into your heaven as we come to worship you here on earth. Amen.

• SCRIPTURE READING: Revelation 4:1-11

P: Our scripture reading for this day is from the Book of Revelation, Chapter 4.

C: Glory to you O Lord.

4 After this I looked, and there in heaven a door stood open! And the first voice, which I had heard speaking to me like a trumpet, said, "Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after this." ²At once I was in the spirit, and there in heaven stood a throne, with one seated on the throne! ³And the one seated there looks like jasper and carnelian, and around the throne is a rainbow that looks like an emerald. ⁴Around the throne are twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones are twenty-four elders, dressed in white robes, with golden crowns on their heads. ⁵Coming from the throne are flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and in front of the throne burn seven flaming torches, which are the seven spirits of God; ⁶and in front of the throne there is something like a sea of glass, like crystal. Around the throne, and on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: ⁷the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with a face like a human face, and the fourth living creature like a flying eagle.

⁸And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and inside. Day and night without ceasing they sing, "Holy, holy, holy, the Lord God the Almighty, who was and is and is to come." ⁹And whenever the living creatures give glory and honor and thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives forever and ever, ¹⁰the twenty-four elders fall before the one who is seated on the throne and worship the one who lives forever and ever; they cast their crowns before the throne, singing, ¹¹"You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created."

• SERMON

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Lamb who was

slain, Jesus Christ, our Savior and our Lord, amen.

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I really needed to read and study this passage from the Apocalypse of John this week. I mean it's been a pretty frustrating and busy week. I really needed to hear once again this description of Heaven and Heavenly Worship. With Covid on the attack again and my niece in Alabama and her husband both contracting this new Delta variant, as well as some here in our own congregation, this round of the Pandemic seems to be hitting even harder than it did last year, mostly for those who are not vaccinated. Add to that, my frustration with a certain furniture company who has promised us delivery of our new kitchen table and chairs since March and they keep scheduling delivery and then cancelling at the last minute or not even cancelling, just failing to show up. All this has my blood sugars on the rise and my iron levels on the run. Yes, life can get to the best of us and wear us down to the point of breaking...

That's why this reading from the 4th chapter of the book of Revelation came as such a breath of fresh air this week. I really needed to hear and visualize the how stunningly beautiful worshipping our great, almighty, and all knowing God can be. As I read all the commentaries about this chapter of Revelation, I kept hitting a dead end when it came to the Gospel and the Good News of Jesus Christ, until I received the call from Morris Furniture 1 hour before the scheduled delivery time saying they had to cancel yet again and there was no rescheduling because the

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table was damaged. That's when I went back to the text and re-read this wonderful description of heavenly worship. As angry and frustrated as I was, there before me I saw clearly those 24 elders and the four living creatures all worshipping God with their entire being. They weren't distracted by all the commotion of life. They simply cast down their golden crowns around that glassy sea and gave everything they had to the worship of their Lord and God. As I meditated on that amazing scene somehow my anger and frustration diminished, and I was filled with peace. My troubles seemed not so important in comparison to this mighty God with all the thunder, lightning, and rainbows...

I just kept thinking about how lucky John was to be invited into such an intimate gathering of God's inner circle, God's Heavenly Council. This is what the book of Revelation offers us today, a glimpse into heaven. I've had people tell me they can't read Revelation because it's just too scary. All the beasts and monsters, all the disasters that devastate the earth... Add to all this fantastic imagery all the interpretations of what this book means and how they claim it describes or predicts the end times. Pastors like John Haggy from San Antonio literally frightening people with his predictions of forth coming doom and gloom for all Christians, at least for those left behind. It's no wonder this book has been one that's either

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shunned out of fear or studied for some piece of evidence that the end times are upon us.

I will tell you right up front; I believe the Book of Revelation was written in the late first or early 2nd century by a man names John who was writing to his Church family from a prison on the island of Patmos off the coast of Greece. John tells us from the beginning he was "In the Spirit" on the Lord's Day when this revelation was given to him. In other words, Eldon you'll appreciate this, John was asleep in Church during Worship on a Sunday when he saw this vision. That's right, the Book of Revelation is the dream John had while he was asleep during the pastor's sermon. Have you ever tried to describe a dream to your spouse, family or friends? It's no wonder we have descriptions of seven headed beasts and famines that ravage the earth.

Actually, this book is a little more than just the superficial dream of an old man. If John was in fact exiled to the small island of Patmos and if he was also one of the elders of the Church in Ephesus, he probably wrote this document to his Church family back home. Since he was a prisoner, he knew all his letters would be opened and read by his captors before being allowed to be sent off the island. That's why John wrote this book in a sort of code language. He was trying to get the letter past his guards so his Church family could read and learn from his

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experience. The codes for things like the beast were meant to be the Roman Empire. The people who originally heard or read this letter would have immediately known who or what the beast represented. John wasn't writing this letter to 21st century Christians, nor was he trying to give us some sort of secret code for how to interpret the signs of the end. We've imposed all of that onto the text.

So, then, let's take a closer look at this Heavenly scene. Before we can understand fully today's glimpse into heaven, let's look at the context of this worship in the throne room of God. So far in Revelation, there have been portions of this letter addressed to the seven churches in Asia. The final church addressed in chapter 3, just before our text for today, has Jesus standing at the door of the lukewarm Church of Laodicea. Jesus says to this congregation that he's standing at their door knocking and if they open the door to him, he will come into their Church and stay with them. (SLIDE) This scene is often misinterpreted as being addressed to each individual person. And if we only open the doors of our hearts and ask Jesus to be our Savior and our Lord, then we will be saved. That's clearly not what Jesus was saying to the Laodicean Church. His words were addressed to the entire congregation not to individuals. Once you understand that fact, then what comes next makes a whole lot more sense. In our text for today, John is

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invited through the open door into heaven to witness this incredible worship scene. The truth is, Christ has already opened the door to heaven, but we keep our earthly doors closed to his presence. How sad is that... How do we keep our doors closed to Jesus today at Trinity? Do we have barriers that keep Jesus out? When our worship practices emphasize our individual practices and piety, where it's just you and God or you and Jesus, we're keeping Jesus from coming into our Worship in a much more meaningful way. That is my earnest desire, for us to worship in such a way that we give up our selves as individuals and become one, even as the grains of wheat, once scattered on the hill become one bread, we are gathered from across this territory to become one people of God. We do that by eating of one loaf of bread and drinking from one cup of salvation which are the body and blood of our Savior, Jesus. In so doing we're removing our crowns, all our selfish, self-centered attitudes and ways and surrendering our entire bodies, minds, and souls to God our Father. Did you notice who was at the center of this worship scene? God is on His throne and everything else is around that throne. Humans are not at the center... You aren't at the center of God's throne, that place is reserved for God alone.

At this point we probably need to lighten things up a bit... Did you hear about the electrician who became a priest? He had a shocking revelation... I think sometimes we take ourselves and our life too seriously. Sometimes we just need to

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forget our troubles and cares and throw our crowns at the feet of the throne of God and abandon ourselves to the worship experience. I don't know about you, but my crown is too heavy and takes up so much of my energy just keeping it in place and protected from all the people who covet it or who try to tell me I'm wearing it incorrectly... Worshipping God rightly. We are finally able to safely remove our crowns and give them back to the one where they belong in the first place.

Thanks be to God for opening the door of heaven so we could get this glimpse of true, pure worship. May we continually examine our own Worship practices to find places where we are keeping our door closed to the presence of Jesus. May God bless you with your own invitation to come and worship even if it means dreaming during the sermon... May we never become lukewarm to the invitation of Jesus, but always stay open to experience His glorious presence right here in our little slide of heaven we call Trinity Lutheran Church. Amen.
