


Jesus Prays in a Solitary Place

35 Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. **36** Simon and his companions went to look for him, **37** and when they found him, they exclaimed: "Everyone is looking for you!"

³⁸ Jesus replied, "Let us go somewhere else—to the nearby villages—so I can preach there also. That is why I have come." ³⁹ So he travelled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.

We rejoice that God has indeed made all things well, to reflect his beauty: **"All the beauty I see he has given to me, and his giving is gentle as silence... At the turn of each tide he is there at my side and his touch is as gentle as silence"** (Singing the Faith 431)
