## *From the Pastor's Desk*

Dear brothers and sisters,

There is a very old Italian carol that tells the reason why the Magi started to travel. Each one of them told their story and all of them finish saying that at night they could not sleep, and they saw a star in heaven. I wanted to reflect a little bit on this line. Many times, in my life I have reflected upon this passage, not being able to sleep is an indication of worry, of being unfulfilled, of being worried and anxious. This is something that we have all experienced, when we are in a crossroad time of our lives or things are not looking bright for us. Usually, this not being able to sleep is accompanied by fear, be it of the future or sickness or heartbreak. It is in this situation of not being fulfilled that God has found us all. Today at the Epiphany we celebrate that God not only revealed to the People of the Covenant but also to us who are not part of the people. God has come also for us, those who did not have a Covenant with him but also could not sleep, many times in fear. For this reason, this Feast is a celebration for those who are waiting for an answer in our lives, for a sign of something more. Rejoice! Because today Christ has been presented to the All the Nations in the persons of the Magi. Today an answer has also been given to us, who without merit of ours have been given the chance to experience the Love that God has for us.

During this month, we will be working on the floor of Lennon Hall (Gym) and thus it cannot be used. For this reason, during the month of January, baptisms will be on Saturday at 12:45pm and we are adding a Mass in Spanish on Sunday at 1:30 pm to accommodate those attending the 12 Noon Mass in Lennon Hall.
