CARETAKERS OF SACRED LAND

Many years ago in 1872, farmland owned by the Todd and Derrickson families was purchased by the Knights of Pythias and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows who transformed it into a 42 acre cemetery on both sides of N. Market Street. A prominent 19th century landscape architect, Herman Schwartzman, designed the southeast side of the cemetery in a grid pattern (1872). In 1899, the northwest side was designed in a picturesque serpentine pattern by cemetery superintendent Goldsmith C. Nailor. Initially, 200 trees were planted at Riverview costing \$222.The cemetery is still known for its majestic and flowering trees, cared for since 2008 by our professional pro bono partner, Kerns Brothers Tree Service, (now A Davey Company).

Today these 42 acres are a valuable, peaceful, green-space in an urban setting with approximately 5,000 homes and businesses surrounding it. And within these acres are flat markers, upright monuments, military markers, private mausoleums, and a community mausoleum containing 260 crypts. The cemetery has approximately four miles of interior roadways making all sections accessible. The gates are always open and we count on you to watch over it.

FHRC volunteers in partnership with Delaware Center of Horticulture planted 50 bare root trees in 2009 and 50 more in 2014 to reduce storm water run-

off and improve air quality in the city. FHRC volunteers created four flower beds to beautify the cemetery and neighborhood. Plants left at gravesites are planted in these gardens rather than being thrown away. You will find the Daylily Garden outside the Washington Street fence line, the Daffodil Garden inside the Market Street fence, a perennial garden in memory of babies overlooking Eastlawn Avenue, and a circular garden around the upright children's monument in Section J.

As we approach the spring let us honor the earth, show respect to this historic cemetery, learn about the lives of men and women of all nationalities who are "at rest", and find our own special way to contribute resources of time, energy, skills, and money. Spring is here! Signs of life are everywhere! Join us as we care for the grass, flowers, and trees!
