
many new families moving in to the town with many houses being sold lately and I believe that it is and will be our fantastic town and community spirit that will want to keep them here.

The Battle at Brinkworth

On Saturday, April 17, the Brinkworth Special Projects Group hosted the S.A. Lawn Mower Racing Association for the first 'Battle at Brinkworth'. The event was held on the back oval at the Primary School and attended by around 500 people across the day. A vibrant BBQ tent, cool and hot drinks and a licensed area, all staffed by volunteers, provided catering. There was also a small but significant Boot Sale near the entry gate. Despite a few teething problems it was by all accounts, "a cracker of a day!"

The racing consisted of thirty mowers spread across four categories, each racing a number of heats in a rolling program that went late into the afternoon. The Modified A category, with engines up to 450cc, was the largest drawcard with thrills, spills, noise and speed sufficient to satisfy the discerning revheads amongst us. Once the dust settled down and drivers became familiar with the track, there were up to three changes of lead per lap. It doesn't get much better than that in motor sport.

A large number of local and regional sponsors supported the event in a multitude of ways and to them we are exceedingly grateful. Without doubt, however, the greatest highlight of the day were the individuals who turned up, offered to help, rolled up their sleeves and got to it. We cannot single out people (not the Brinkworth way), but just offer gratitude to those who turned up early and helped on the gate, the crew in the BBQ tent, the flag marshals, and the pick up and pack down crews. This

is community spirit, and this allows events like this to be a success.

Over \$3000 was raised on the day. These funds will go towards events and projects in and around our town. We hope to iron out the inevitable glitches that did occur and be back for a second Battle at Brinkworth next year. We hope to see you there!

Comments from Dave Willsher (PADARC) who judged the ute muster

There's something very special about our country shows. Its not only the atmosphere, it's often the feeling of welcome from the organisers, the volunteers, and the people that put these things together.

Brinkworth Country Fair is one such show that I enjoy immensely, mainly because they really make us feel part of the show, which we in fact are. This year was no exception. We had a great time, a little down on the number of cars and utes but a good display never the less.

We lined up in what seemed like a council depot at first but there was plenty of room. It's a pity but I think most people understood the oval just isn't available this time of year. Up front, Andrew Todd and Alan Jones had set up the engine display which was in full swing with several engines running pumping water. This, as always, was the most popular exhibit. Just farther ahead, all the stalls had all been sited so we could walk along one side and then the other.

There were probably about 30 stalls in all selling all sorts of things including plants, crafts and art, and my favourite, home made pies, pasties, and the best sausage rolls I've ever tasted. Then another lady with home made conserves. We ended up with enough apricot jam to see out the year.

Some exhibits were really interesting, like Gumby's Wildlife Sanctuary from Wandearah with baby kangaroos we were able to cuddle, and a young red kangaroo that was chewing on everything in sight.

There was plenty of food on sale, with a BBQ, tea and coffee, even ice cream and milk shakes.

The musical entertainment was provided by a pretty good band this year. At least they played some nice old fashioned tunes and very little of that bang bang rubbish. Chairs were laid out in front for people to sit on and the highlight was the travelling magician who entertained the kids, young and old, with a fine magic act covering some really good tricks. He was very funny and even explained the tricks to the children who then tried them and, of course, they didn't work. He had a set routine that went on for about 45 minutes for each session.

The important job for me as guest judge was to examine all the vehicles. I take this job very seriously and we have to get this right. The categories are quite clear and lots of thought goes into this. Our club did alright with Peter Crossman taking out best ute, and John Yates with the old Holden FJ, and Craig Johnston with the green and cream Holden FC took out best classic first and second prize. People's choice was a beautiful yellow Holden Torana. This had not been included in the competition as some people prefer not to enter. That was a shame because this car would have taken best in show but all vehicle's are included in the people's choice category and this year there were some 300 entries.

The prizes were all the same - very nice silver trophies for all winners. I thought that was quite clever.

Congratulations to Norma Hardy - bet that was her idea.






