It was agreed that the Club should hold records of Registration and Comprehensive Insurance / Third Party Property Damage Insurance to ensure that the Club is not in a vulnerable position due a Members accident or misadventure.

It was agreed that the Club Committee meet and draw up a Club Rule requiring copies of 'Certificate of Conditional Registration" and proof of Comprehensive Insurance / Third Party Property Damage Insurance be provided. This Rule to be implemented as soon as convenient and enforced in 2023.

We have had a few membership enquiries which is great but the club has to be sure we are not being used as an excuse for cheap rego. Summerland is a great club and we welcome car lovers to join in our many activities.

The club comradery was on display at the Brooms Head coffee run. We all had a chatty time there as well a great pub meal at Maclean. Many thanks to Julie and Jeff Snow for organising somewhere different to drive and thoroughly enjoy. I also really enjoyed our trip to Dorrigo and Armidale where the group seemed to get right into the spirit of fun (and food).

## PRESIDENTS RUN TO DORRIGO AND ARMIDALE, 19-21 AUGUST BY JULIE MCKAY

We had an early start on Friday morning to meet at Oliver's at Ferry Park, Maclean for coffee. Early arrivals sat in the sun on the front verandah, while later arrivals enjoyed the view of the river on the back verandah. Once we had all arrived and had been fed and watered we continued down the highway through Coffs Harbour and on to Urunga to meet at the Ocean View Hotel for our first pub meal of the weekend. The weather was glorious and after a very pleasant lunch in the back beer garden, many of us went for a stroll on the boardwalk from the pub along the edge of the Kalang and Bellinger rivers to the ocean while others pushed on to do a bit of shopping in Bellingen.




We all continued the drive up the mountain through Bellingen and on to Dorrigo where we checked into the lovely old Heritage Hotel Motel and then gathered for pre-dinner drinks on the upstairs verandah overlooking the quiet town. We had a brief moment of panic when our president came rushing up to tell us that someone had told the hotel staff to cancel our dinner reservation because we were going to the RSL for dinner instead. All was cleared up by Gayl who found out that it was the other car club also staying at the pub who had told them they were eating out. We later had a quick chat with one of the members of the other car club (Hastings Auto Restorers Car Club from Port Macquarie) who was there with his Singer Gazelle 1960 convertible which he told

us was one of only four in Australia. We had a lovely dinner in the pub bistro, a few more drinks (a few too many for yours truly!) and then off to bed in our huge comfortable rooms.



Next morning, after breakfast in the hotel dining room, we set off to visit Dangar Falls, the first of the waterfalls for the day. The drive there took us past the entrance to the Dorrigo Sewage Treatment Works where there is a "Lavatree" (species Pissina Flushturdum – uniquely found only in Australia!). By chance, we also came upon what at first appeared to be a train graveyard but which turned out to be the Dorrigo Steam Railway Museum, the largest collection of trains, carriages and railway equipment in the world. The museum is privately owned and not as yet open to the public due to issues with the local council, but they have grand plans to open sometime in the future. We were lucky enough to have a close look at some of their collection of steam engines including a Garratt locomotive (the largest locomotive in the southern hemisphere).



Next stop for the day was the Canopy Café at the Dorrigo Rainforest Centre to have coffee, to pick up our sandwiches for lunch and to have a look at the view out over the Dorrigo National Park from the Skywalk. From there we went to the upper section of Ebor Falls in the Guy Fawkes

National Park and finally the Wollomombi Falls in the Oxley Wild Rivers

National Park where we had a late lunch and where some of us were

lucky enough to see some spectacular rock falls from the

viewing platform.

On to Armidale where we checked into the magnificently restored Art Deco Tattersalls Hotel, got dolled up for pre-dinner drinks in the guest lounge, then dinner in the lovely dining room. Sunday morning we had a late start to sleep in, have breakfast or wander the streets of Armidale in the freezing cold, then onto Guyra to stop at the Car Museum and bookshop in the old Burgess Garage then finally we

Specifications of Shearing

. All sheep to be carried from the pen and put quietly own on the floor.

The crutch, brisket and points to be properly mmed, and the belly wool to be removed without juring the fleece by twice-cutting.

The belly wool to be detached from the fleece and put

In opening the Jeece at the neck, both blades of the ears to be kept under the wool and close to the skin so to prevent twice-cutting. No Shearer allowed to run shears through the fleece so as to break it down the stre or back.


No Shearer allowed to put his foot or knee on any

Any Shearer injuring any sheep, or cutting any of the ts of any ewe or lamb or ram will forfeit 8 shillings. Any Shearer turning out a sheep with a cut afficiently tarred shall at once bring it back to the aring floor and tar the wound.

All sheep with horns growing into head or eyes, and unmarked lambs, to be put back to catching pen by Shearer or forfeit price for such sheep. ules and Regulations



## Agreement Shearers had to sign before shearing sheep on farmer's properties. Specifications of Shearing

All sheep to be carried from the pen and put quietly down on the floor.

The crutch, brisket and points to be properly trimmed, and the belly wool to be removed without injuring the fleece by twice-cutting.

The belly wool to be detached from the fleece and put aside.

In opening the fleece at the neck, both blades of the shears to be kept under the wool and close to the skin so to prevent twice-cutting. No Shearer allowed to run the shears through the fleece so as to break it down the centre or back.

No Shearer allowed to put his foot or knee on any sheep.

Any Shearer injuring any sheep, or cutting any of the parts of any ewe or lamb or ram will forfeit 8 shillings.

Any Shearer turning out a sheep with a cut sufficiently tarred shall at once bring it back to the shearing floor and tar the wound.


All sheep with horns growing into head or eyes, and unmarked lambs, to be put back to catching pen by Shearer or forfeit price for such sheep.
