

On September 11th will be the 20th anniversary of 9/11. I am sure most of us can remember that day, where we were and what we were doing when we heard the news. I was living in Coeur d' Alene, Idaho and was at a job training workshop for a new job that I had started. During one of the breaks the TV was on in the lobby and everyone was gathered around staring at it. All of us were in shock when those staring at the TV told us what was happening. It didn't seem real. 20 years later I can still see those images of the planes crashing into the Twin Towers. Recent events in Afghanistan have also left me with a numb feeling for what is happening in our world. The need for peace and unity still exists both locally and throughout the world.

As a pastor and a Christian I wish I could tell everyone that it is all going to be okay, nothing to worry about. That would be false but it does not mean that we should focus on those things that cause us to worry, fear, or stress about. It is a given that we will face trials and tribulations and while we may feel powerless to change them – we can change how we react to them. On 9/12 there were two very different and distinct reactions. Some became very fearful, worried about what was going to happen to them and were glued to their television. Others lived their lives without fear because they knew that our military would not let that go unanswered. Flags were displayed proudly on porches, vehicles, front lawns, and businesses. All of the news people wore American flag pins on their lapels, same with politicians, and many, many Americans.

For us, our hope lies in Jesus, the Prince of Peace. Yet what is the root of most of the fighting and conflict in the world – religion. It is a "Holy War" that justifies violent behavior. Christianity in the past did the same thing – convert or die mentality was employed by missionaries and the church. Remember the song, He Has the Whole World in His Hands. God wants all people to live in peace and unity. Jesus' last words to his disciples was "Peace be with you" (John 20:19). In our fear, anger, rage, stress and doubt we need the peace of Christ more than ever. There will be a service of remembrance for 9/11 at the Veteran's Memorial in Lake Mills at 10am. Whether you attend the service or not take time that day to pray for our country, our community, and our church.

Motion by Nancy; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bobbi to approve the minutes from the July 22, 2021 meeting as read by Karen. Motion carried.

Motion by Joanne; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Leann to acknowledge the treasurer's report as presented by Nancy with a balance of \$23,379.84. Motion by Sandy; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bobbi to contribute \$100 to the Northwood Volunteer Fire Department. Motion carried.

SPPRC will meet on September, 7, 2021.

Mission report by Leann: So far 49 hygiene kits; 66 student kits; 3 layette kits. Ingathering will be November 6, 2021. Phyllis Tilson has made 197 bags for these kits.

NOW report by Bobbi: Discussion of visitation to members. Discussion of worship ideas.

Trustees report by Sandy: (1) The sidewalk project will be started soon. (2) The George Kesler bequest memorial trust fund in the amount of \$10,000 will be moved to the Memorial Fund. Motion by Sandy; 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bobbi. Motion carried. (3) \$250,000 of the Bequest Fund will be invested for 3 years at 2.35%. Trustees account balance is \$31,155.62.

Discussion on wearing masks recommended at worship starting this Sunday, August 15, 2021.




