

FLS Revised Covid Policy- 12/920

Student or Staff Testing COVID Positive

Any student or staff testing positive must follow current CDC recommendations for isolation. Asymptomatic cases must isolate for 10 days from a positive test. Symptomatic cases must isolate for at least 10 days from onset of symptoms and be fever free for 24 hours with symptoms improving prior to returning to school. Exceptions may be made by the local health department.

COVID Exposure - In School

Individuals Properly Masked

Any student or staff who is exposed to a person testing positive and the exposure occurred in the school setting and both parties were **properly masking**, then the exposed person may continue to attend school but must monitor for covid symptoms including temperature checks twice a day for 14 days.

Individual(s) Not Properly Masked

Any student or staff who is exposed to a person testing positive and the exposure occurred in the school setting and either party was **not masking properly** and they were less than 6ft apart for a cumulative 15min or more, then the exposed person must quarantine for 14 days at home.

In Class Quarantine

For any classroom where all students/staff are determined by the health department to have been exposed IN the school setting: If all students and staff were **properly masking** and no contact less than 6ft for a cumulative 15min or more occurred with the person testing positive, then those exposed may continue in person learning. We will maintain "**in classroom quarantine**" procedures for 14 days. Students will not be allowed to attend extended care during this time unless there is a teacher/substitute who is available to provide this care inside the affected classroom. Parents will be notified if extended care will or will not be available ahead of time.

In the context of a class exposure, any student or staff not masking properly AND having close contact within 6ft for a cumulative 15min or more will quarantine at home for 14 days.

COVID Exposure - Outside School

For any exposure occurring outside the school setting that meets CDC criteria for a close contact, the exposed person must follow CDC and state guidelines and quarantine at home for 14 days.
