READING FOR THE WEEK: Mathew 11: 25-30

Message: "We should try to be gentle towards others, as Jesus himself was gentle."

MY YOKE IS EASY and MY BURDEN LIGHT.

Today, gentleness is not regarded as it once was. Our word 'gentleman' testifies to this. Today, violence is more popular than gentleness. TV, Videos, Movies, computer games and the follow up daily storytelling and discussions on "battered woman" and "abused child" has given it a widespread audience. All this has taken its toll on us. In the houses and communities, people shouting, kicking things, throwing things and even strike one another.

Jesus taught us to be gentle. Just like the father in 'The Parable of the Prodigal Son. Jesus wants us to be 'Gentle and Humble in spirit.' To pray to God 'Simply and Trustfully' like a child with its father.

Have you ever tried to get a solution for an emotional problem using money but your emotional situation remains the same?

Well, I have Good News for you today! The answer or solution to your problem is Jesus Christ. He knows all our weakness and that sometimes the little strength we have can fail us.
